

## EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION

This year the Eucharistic Procession will take place at 3p.m. this Sunday 18th June from St. Mary and St. John's Church to East Gate followed by Benediction in Car Park We hope to have a large attendance BE THERE!

TO YOU GLORY AND PRAISE FOR EVERMORE

"The institution of the eucharist has a special memorial the Mass of the Lord's Supper, when Christ the Lord shared a meal with his disciples and gave them the sacrament of his body and blood to be celebrated in the Church. The solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) further proposes the cultus of the blessed sacrament to the faithful so that they may celebrate the wonderful works of God, signified by the sacrament and accomplished by the paschal mystery of Christ. This solemnity is also intended to teach the faithful how to share in the eucharistic sacrifice and to have it more profoundly influence their life, to revere the presence of Christ the Lord in this sacrament, and to offer the thanks due for God's gifts. In its devotion the Church has handed down as a distinctive feature of the celebration of this solemnity a procession in which the eucharist is carried solemnly and with singing through the streets, and the Christian people give public witness to their belief in the sacrament of the eucharist and to their devotion.

## GARDA TRAFFIC PLAN FOR BALLINCOLLIG EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION

Hereunder are details of the Garda Traffic arrangements which will come into operation at 3.00p.m. on Sunday 18th June until the Eucharistic Procession is over;-

West Park Hotel/Leo Murphy Junction

Motorists approaching Ballincollig from Cork City will be diverted to the left via Leo Murphy Road (New Link Road) and onto the Kilumney Road. This will facilitate traffic to by-pass Ballincollig Town Centre and re-join the Cork-Macroom Road (N.22) near the White Horse Inn.

Castle Park/East Gate Residents

Traffic coming from Castle Park and the Powdermills (G.A.A. area) will be requested to drive towards the City and may use the Leo Murphy Road if they intend travelling to Macroom or to the West. Traffic coming from the City direction and intending to drive into Castle Park Road or to the G.A.A. Pavilion will be allowed to proceed.

Muskerry Estate Residents

Traffic coming from Muskerry Estate and intending to travel towards Cork City should drive via the rear entrance of Muskerry Estate onto the Kilumney Road. Traffic going from Muskerry Estate towards Macroom, will be allowed drive out the front entrance of the estate and turn left.

Traffic coming from the West

All traffic approaching Ballincollig from the West will be diverted at O'FLYNN'S CROSS near the White Horse Inn Bar and Restaurant. This traffic will be able to join the Cork-Macroom Road (N.22) near the West Park Hotel.

The traffic diversion will be in operation for approximately one hour. Every effort will be made by the Gardaí to cause as little inconvenience as possible to motorists

#### SAINTS THIS WEEK

Monday 19th - St. Romuald died 1027. Reformer of the solitary life, founded by the Camaldolese.

Tuesday 20th - Irish Martyrs. Seventeen Irish martyrs, men and women, cleric and lay, put to death for the Catholic faith between 1579 and 1654, were beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1992. Six Catholics of Irish birth or connection executed for the faith in England had already been beatified in 1929 and 1987.

Wednesday 21st - St. Aloysius Gonzaga born in Lombardy in 1568, was intended by his father for a soldier's career. He was determined however to join the Jesuits and his strong will prevailed. As a model novice he worked in the plague hospital and caught the fever, dying at the age of 23. Patron of youth.

Thursday 22nd - St. Paulinus, 355-431, bishop of Nola in the Campania, wrote letters and poems.
St. John Fisher, 1469-1535, as Vice-Chancellor, built Christ's and St. John's Colleges, Cambridge. Bishop of Rochester. His love of truth brought about his death.

St. Thomas More, 1478-1535, the first commoner to be Lord Chancellor of England, suffered martyrdom also under Henry VIII. Patron of Lawyers.

The Car Draw planned for June 24th has been deferred to October 19th






