CHRIST FOUNDED A CHURCH

"Of course I'm a Christian, but I don't have anything to do with the Church". How often do you hear people make this comment these days! Probably it is a remark made out of lack of knowledge of the Bible rather then out of any form of malice.

Even a cursory reading of the New Testament shows that Christ founded a Church.

The mission of Christ:- He was sent into the world by his Heavenly Father to cleanse all men from sin, to make them children of God and heirs to His kingdom.

The mission of the Apostles:- Christ preached to but a few. He sent the Apostles to preach to all. He sent them to teach, to govern and to minister. They obeyed His word.

The foundation of the Church: Christ, by giving the Apostles this commission, thereby founded a society, His Church - Christ saves through His Church. Christ said to His Apostles, "As the Father has sent me, so also, I send you". He sent them out into the "whole world" to "all nations" and promised to be with them "all days" until the end of time. He sent them (1) to teach all men His doctrine, (2) to rule all men with His authority, (3) to make all men holy by means of the sacraments which He instituted. In sending them in that way, He founded a religious society, His Church.

In a society, be it sporting, political or religious, there must be (1) a number of people, (2) a shared objective, (3) an agreed way of attaining that objective, (for example, a peaceful means or by force of arms), (4) some form of authority to bind the members together. A society like the G.A.A., for instance has all these four essentials: members, aims, an agreed way of working towards those aims and a ruling body.

The Church that Jesus founded was a Society: (1) the Apostles and other disciples formed the membership, (2) the aim was the sanctification and salvation of all men, (3) the means was belief in the teachings of Christ, obedience to God's commandments and use of the sacred rites like the Mass and the sacraments, (4) the authority was the Apostles led by St. Peter. Because it was Christ Himself who gave these four essentials to His Church, He is therefore, the founder of the Church. The Apostles were not self-appointed, they were not appointed by the people, they were appointed by Christ. And after their appointment they were not left to their own discretion; they were always attended by the assistance of Christ, "Behold I am with you all days to the end of time".

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

22 Sunday Acts. 5:12-16. Ps. 117. Apoc. 1:9-13,17-19. Jn. 20:19-31. *Lect I: 444* the account of the doubts of the apostle Thomas sets out to answer the question of how we can believe as firmly as those first disciples who had seen the Lord. And we are shown first that those first disciples did not come easily to faith. Because their faith was tested and tried we can have confidence in their testimony.

23 Monday Acts. 4:23-31. Ps. 2. Jn. 3:1-8. *Lect I:447*Jesus is the light. That light led Nicodemus to faith in Jesus as more than a wonder-worker and teacher of the law. Enlightened by Christ the disciples prayed and were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to proclaim the word of God boldly.

24 Tuesday Acts. 4:32-37. Ps. 92. Jn. 3:7-15. *Lect I:449*Jesus is the perfect revealer of God whose revelation reaches its climax in his exaltation on the cross. Faith is an active response to Jesus.

25 Wednesday 1 Pet 5:5-14. Ps. 88. Mk. 16:15-20. Lect II:1005

26 Thursday Acts. 5:27-33. Ps. 33. Jn. 3:31-36. Lect I:454

St. Peter speaking before the officials says clearly that the apostles are the authentic witnesses to the events which are God's Spirit at work.

27 Friday Acts. 5:34-42. Ps. 26. Jn. 6:1-15. *Lect I:456*Jesus communicates his life-giving power through his living word and the gift of his own life in the eucharistic bread.

28 Saturday Acts. 6:1-71. Ps. 32. Jn. 6:16-21. *Lect I:459* The Church continues to grow and the apostles re-order the ministries to cope with different needs. the Spirit works in the Church, and brings peace.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

Monday 23rd - St. Adalbert of Prague, was born in Bohemia (Czech Republic) around 956. In 981 he returned to Prague and around the age of twenty-six was consecrated the first native bishop of the city. Zealous for reform on the Cluniac lines, he met much opposition. He withdrew to Rome and entered the Benedictines. Adalbert was then released from his episcopal responsibilities and devoted himself to missionary work among the Prussians on the Polish coast, where he was martyred. Although apparently a failure, his influence was enormous and inspired many to take up the missionary work in central Europe. He is remembered for his prayerfulness, his concern for the poor, and his courage in the face of opposition.

Wednesday 25th - St. Mark, was closely connected with the preaching of Sts Peter, Paul and Barnabus. His Gospel was probably written at Rome when he was with Paul, and is traditionally viewed as representing St. Peter's approach to the preaching of the good news. Later tradition has him as an interpreter for St. Peter. His symbol is a winged lion.

Saturday 28th - St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort, 1673-1716, as a young priest was placed as a chaplain in a hospital for the sick poor, organising a congregation of the Sisters of Divine Wisdom to care for them. Soon afterward Louis discovered his true vocation preaching missions. Most important was the spirit of prayer which he instilled, especially with the recitation of the rosary. It is believed that Louis did more than any other man to spread the practice in France. A few years before his death, Louis gathered together a few priests who became the first members of his Company of Mary. He died at Saint-Laurent-sur-Sevre on 28 April 1716.



Fatima, where the Blessed Virgin appeared to the three children, Lucia, Francesco and Jacinta in 1917 is now one of the greatest Marian Shrines in the world. Fatima was officially recognised by the church in 1930 and now receives millions of pilgrims especially during the Feast Days which are on the 13th of each month from May to October. Our Pilgrimage will be accompanied by a Spiritual Director and representative of Premier Travel.
