CORK AND ROSS MISSION COLLECTION

In 1957 Pope Pius XII called on the Church in Europe and North America to come to the help of the churches in the Third World. While the developed world at the time had an abundance of vocations to the priesthood the developing world was experiencing an acute shortage. The Pope suggested the priests from the developed world might be sent on loan to Dioceses in missionary lands.

The response was so generous that it became quite commonplace to find priests from dioceses in North America working in Central and South America.

Cork & Ross took the idea further by taking over responsibility for a whole territory within a South American Diocese. The Peru Mission became one of Cork's favourite projects and unlike the missionary efforts of many other dioceses, it has endured for thirty years, surviving terrorism, earthquake and political upheaval.

Today, four Cork priests work in Peru in the same area where the founder missionaries, who included our late Bishop began the enterprise. Four more Cork & Ross priests work in Ecuador - a country which, as its name indicates, lies precisely on the equator.

Many sisters for Cork have also worked on the Mission over the past thirty years. Both the Mercy and Bon Secours Sisters have increased their numbers by receiving into their Orders large numbers of Peruvian girls. So successful have the Bon Secours been in this regard that their Peru community has become an independent province under a Peruvian superioress.

It is comparatively rare for Diocesan Missionary projects to last as long as that of Cork and Ross which has been going strong for over thirty years. Initial enthusiasm wanes. Other areas of religious activity come into vogue. Volunteers become scarce. How does one explain the perseverance of the Cork and Ross Mission? Under the grace of God there are two possible explanations: the continuous flow of volunteer priests and nuns and the unfailing financial backing by the faithful in Cork. Without the generous support of the May collection year after year the Peru Mission would have ceased to exist long ago. This weekend that annual collection comes round again. You can rest assured that your contribution will be put to the best possible use to bring help and hope to the most needy in our mission areas.



GARDA TRAFFIC PLAN FOR BALLINCOLLIG EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION

Hereunder are details of the Garda Traffic arrangements which will come into operation at 6.30p.m. on Saturday, 9th June 2001, until the Eucharistic Procession is over:-

West Park Hotel/Leo Murphy Road Junction

Motorists approaching Ballincollig from Cork City, will be **diverted to the left** via **Leo Murphy Road** (New Link Road) and onto the Kilumney Road. This will facilitate traffic to by-pass Ballincollig Town Centre and re-join the Cork-Macroom Road (N.22) near the White Horse Inn.

Castle Park/East Gate Residents

Traffic coming from Castle Park and the Powdermills (G.A.A. area) will be requested to **drive towards the City** and may use the <u>Leo Murphy Road</u> if they intend travelling to Macroom or to the West. Traffic coming from the City direction and intending to drive into **Castle Park** or to the **G.A.A. Pavilion** will be allowed to proceed.

Muskerry Estate Residents

Traffic coming from Muskerry Estate and intending to travel towards Cork City should drive via the rear entrance of Muskerry Estate onto the Kilumney Road.

Traffic going from Muskerry Estate towards Macroom, will be allowed to drive out the front entrance of the estate and **turn left**.

Traffic coming from the West

All traffic approaching Ballincollig from the West **will be diverted at O'FLYNN'S CROSS** near the White Horse Inn Bar & Restaurant. This traffic will be able to re-join the Cork/Macroom Road (N. 22) near the West Park Hotel.

The traffic diversion will be in operation for approximately one hour. Every effort will be made by the Gardaí to cause as little inconvenience as possible to motorists
