The first coming of the Holy Spirit on the Church was wind and fire and the telling of God's wonderful deeds in many tongues. The Spirit also comes as many gifts for the common good, bringing peace along with God's forgiving power.

ST. THERESE

St. Therese was a French Carmelite nun who died of TB in 1897, aged 24 years. Her parents, Zelie and Louis Martin have been declared Venerable by the Church. Some writers maintain that Maria, Pauline and Celine, her sisters, who lived to a ripe old age in the convent were even greater saints. Popular devotion to Leonie, regarded as the black sheep of the family, is growing. Her mother died when she was four years old, and her father died from a painful illness while she was in the convent. Two infant brothers and two sisters pre-deceased her. There is scarcely a church in Ireland that does not have either a statue or a picture, or a stained glass window of St. Therese.

She left behind a series of writings which, when they were published in 1898 under the heading "The Story of a Soul", caused a sensation. Millions of copies were sold. So popular did she become that she was canonised in 1925. She has been described as the greatest saint of modern times.

Her basic teaching is that The Lord loves and values all people equally. "We cannot love unless we are first loved. Listen to the words of St. John: 'We love because He first loved us'." It is only this realisation that will bring ultimate happiness. From her early childhood St. Therese fell in love with Jesus Christ. Childlike simplicity and trust in The Lord as a loving Father are the basis of her spirituality summed up in her "Little Way".

She has important things to say on many of the issues that are being emphasised today, e.g., her emphasis on the Bible, the Eucharist, the Holy Spirit, and the missionary work of the Church.

Some of her well known sayings are:

"I will spend my heaven doing good on earth".

"I kissed the whole family, then knelt for my father's blessing. He knelt down too, and he was crying as he blessed me" (leaving home for the last time).

"Prayer is a cry from the heart".

"It is above all, the gospel which occupies my mind when I am at prayer. I am always finding fresh lights there, hidden meanings which have meant nothing to me up to now".

"I learned from experience that joy does not reside in the things about us, but in the very depths of the soul; one can have it in the gloom of a dungeon as well as in the palace of a king".

4 Monday Tob. 1:3. 2:1-8. Ps. 111. Mk. 12;1-12. *Lect II:107* Tobit is exiled at Ninevah with his tribe of Naphthali after the fall of Israel. The Book of Tobit calls for a renewal of faith at a difficult time for the people who fear that God has abandoned them. It stresses community and family solidarity in time of trouble, the maintenance of the purity of religious belief in the midst of pagan ways of life, the mediation of God through angels, and the importance of Israel for the salvation of other nations.

5 Tuesday Tob. 2:9-14. Ps. 111. Mk. 12:13-17. *Lect II:110* Tobit is blinded but does not blame God. He seeks always to be just and honest.

6 Wednesday Tob. 3:1-11. 16-17. Ps. 24. Mk. 12:18-27. Lect II:114 Tobit gives an example of prayer in the home, and Sarah has recourse also to the Lord. Their prayer finds favour before the Lord. 7 Thursday Tob. 6;10-11; 7:1-14. 8:4-9. Ps. 127. Mk. 12:28-34. Lect II:115

Tobias, Tobit's son, goes off to find a bride, guided by the angel Raphael. In Raguel's home he accepts Sarah as his bride. She had had seven husbands one after another killed by the demon, Asmadeus. They pray with the best of intentions for God's protection.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

Monday 4th June - Sts. Charles Lwanga and companions, 22 Ugandan youths martyred 1886.

Tuesday 5th June - **St. Boniface,** 673-754, was born at Crediton in Devonshire and educated in monastery schools in England. He went as a missionary to Germany. He founded monasteries in Bavaria, that of Fulda in 735.

Wednesday 6th June - St. Norbert, 1080-1134, Archbishop of Magdeburg, Premonstratensian's founder.

St. Jarleth, is said to have been a disciple of St. Enda, and was taught also by St. Benignus. He became abbot-bishop of the monastery he founded at Tuam in the sixth century.

Thursday 7th June - St. Colman, of Dromore, Co. Down, seems to have spent most of his life in that area. Possibly he studied under Caetan of Nendrom, Co. Down and was persuaded by St. MacNissi to settle at Dromore c. 514.

Saturday 9th June - St. Colum Cille, was born in Gartan, Co. Donegal, in 521 and was of royal lineage. He studied under St. Finnian of Moville and St. Finnian of Clonard. He founded monasteries in Derry, Durrow, Iona and possibly Kells. He left Ireland, either for penance or to be a pilgrim for Christ, but Iona became his principal foundation. From it, missionaries undertook the conversion of Northumbria. Columcille spent thirty-four years as an "island soldier". He died on 9 June 597.

GARDA TRAFFIC PLAN FOR BALLINCOLLIG EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION

Hereunder are details of the Garda Traffic arrangements which will come into operation at 6.30p.m. on Saturday, 9th June 2001, until the Eucharistic Procession is over:-

West Park Hotel/Leo Murphy Road Junction

Motorists approaching Ballincollig from Cork City, will be **diverted to the left** via **Leo Murphy Road (New Link Road)** and onto the Kilumney Road. This will facilitate traffic to by-pass Ballincollig Town Centre and re-join the Cork-Macroom Road (N.22) near the White Horse Inn.

Castle Park/East Gate Residents

Traffic coming from Castle Park and the Powdermills (G.A.A. area) will be requested to **drive towards the City** and may use the <u>Leo Murphy Road</u> if they intend travelling to Macroom or to the West. Traffic coming from the City direction and intending to drive into **Castle Park** or to the **G.A.A. Pavilion** will be allowed to proceed.

Muskerry Estate Residents

Traffic coming from Muskerry Estate and intending to travel towards Cork City should drive via the rear entrance of Muskerry Estate onto the Kilumney Road.

Traffic going from Muskerry Estate towards Macroom, will be allowed to drive out the front entrance of the estate and **turn left**.

Traffic coming from the West

All traffic approaching Ballincollig from the West **will be diverted at O'FLYNN'S CROSS** near the White Horse Inn Bar & Restaurant. This traffic will be able to re-join the Cork/Macroom Road (N. 22) near the West Park Hotel.

The traffic diversion will be in operation for approximately one hour. Every effort will be made by the Gardaí to cause as little inconvenience as possible to motorists
