



COMMUNITY GAMES

A fortnight ago twenty-four youngsters from Ballincollig travelled to Mosney, Co. Meath for the ESB sponsored National Community Games Finals.

Special mention must be made of John O'Mahony who was representing Ballincollig and Cork for the ninth consecutive year in Gymnastics. He certainly finished his Community Games career in style, scoring the highest scores of the day in both the floor and vault competitions to secure victory in the Boys U/16 competition. Ballincollig Community Games are very proud of John and his record that includes 5 Gold and 4 Bronze Medals. This indeed will be a very hard act to follow.

Two yound gymnasts who are certainly going places are Robert Noonan and Alison Hayes who won Gold Medals in the Boys U/8 and Girls U/10 competition respectively. This was Alison's second Gold Medal and was well-deserved because of all the hard work she puts in at home and in the Gym. Robert made light of the fact of having six stitches inserted in a head wound on the Wednesday prior to the competition, where he produced his best routine to date to take the gold medal. In the Girls U/12 competition Eva Crowley put in a beautiful performance to secure the Bronze Medal. This was Eva's third bronze medal in four years, which is indeed no mean achievement. Michelle Sheehan had the distinction of winning two medals on the one weekend, winning silver in the Girls U/14 competition and was a member of the Ballincollig U/14 Gymnastics Team which was placed second in the team event. The team including Michelle, her brother David, Lisa O'Donovan, Ann-Marie O'Connell, Denis Moloney and Kieran Buckley made a great attempt to retain the trophy they won last year, but had to give way to a superb Kerry team. The other Ballincollig representative in the individual gymnastics competition was Laura Hayes who was most unfortunate to finish just outside the medals in fifth place in the Girls U/8 competition.

Ballincollig Boys U/16 Table Tennis Team of Eoin Hegarty, Eoin McNally, Mike Spitere, David Buckley and Killian Healy travelled with high hopes of improving on their 4th position last year. They put on a powerful display in defeating the Mayo team from Ballina in the semi-final and last year's winners Cavan's Ballyjamesduff side in the final to win the Gold Medal. They are a great bunch of lads and are to be congratulated on becoming both National Community Games and Irish Schools Champions in the one year. The Ballincollig Girls U/16 Pitch & Putt teams of Elaine Murphy, Sarah McSwiney, Karen O'Brien, Brid Foley and Niamh Fitton put in a great effort to repeat last year's performance of 2nd place. They managed to get ahead of last year's winners, Kilbarrick of Dublin, but found the Galway team too hot to handle on the day. Ballincollig Boys U/16 Pitch & Putt team including Colm Healy, Kevin Foley and Brian O'Keeffe made a great effort and were unlucky to miss out on the medals by just two shots. However there was a great reward for Brian when he was awarded the Gold Medal for the best individual score of the competition. This was the third time in four years that a boy from Ballincollig has won this prize.

A week ago four young athletes travelled to Mosney for the second and final weekend of the National Community Games Finals. On the Saturday both Jennifer O'Leary and Elaine O'Leary competed in their heats of the Girls U/8 60m and Girls U/14 80m Hurdles resepectively, where they qualified for the semifinals. In the semi-finals both girls were desperately unlucky not to make the finals as they were pipped on the line in blanket finishes. In the Girls U/17 Marathon over 80 Girls from all over the 32 Counties lined up at the start including 14 year old Andrea Raggett, who did both herself and Ballincollig proud in finishing 25th. This was an outstanding performance considering the much older opposition.

In the Boys U/17 Marathon Tomas Maunsell led the Cork Team to the Gold Medal, when he ran a brilliant race to finish in 6th position. The Cork Team had a total of 27 points, on ahead of Meath in a very exciting contest. This was Tomas' final year of competing in Community Games, which he finished with a collection of 3 National Gold Medals over the years. The committee of Ballincollig Community Games would like to congratulate Tomas on this achievement.

The local committee wish to make special mention of the team managers and coaches who trained and travelled with the young people, including Marie O'Connell, Claire Sheehan, Michael Healy, Mary O'Mahony, Stacey McCarthy, Sandra O'Leary, Caeliv Donnelly and Neil Sheehan.

A word of thanks also to Mr. Pat Kinsella and his staff at Colaiste Choilm for their support and the use of the school facilities for training during the summer. Gold medals at National Finals are not won without hard training and the willingness of Colaiste Choilm to make its facilities available for Community Games training is greatly appreciated.
