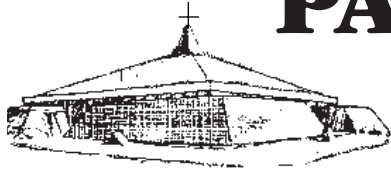

**"FR. PAUL'S HOMILY  
- NATIONAL DAY OF MOURNING"**

We are all gathered here this morning because of an enormous tragedy that should never have happened, a tragedy forced on society, a tragedy that id forced into our homes, our schools and ultimately into our minds. We are living through a truly sad time in the history of our world. We are witness to a mountain of pain and distress, unimaginable to anyone, except those who have gone through the garden of Gethsemane. In the context of that terrible distress and unmanageable pain, everything else pales into insignificance. As young people in our parish, I compliment you for coming here this morning to pray for those who have lost their lives, those who are injured and for all those who suffer the loss of loved ones. We are not just gathered as people from Ballincollig, we are gathered with people all over the globe and join our prayers of love, hope and support to theirs.

How can we quantify the loss of a son, daughter, wife, mother, father or friend. How can we quantify the psychological traumas that will for years obstruct the normality that is so precious in everyday lives.

Only God knows where the fall out from this terrible act of violence will end. Only God knows where the ripples running out from the epicentre of this tragedy will reach. Only God knows because in God's truth we certainly don't know. We can't see that how anyone could possibly believe that such an act could achieve any benefit anytime anywhere. We can't see at any level anything in this mountain of pain and suffering that so many innocent people have so needlessly been asked to endure and because we can't see we cannot find the words to make sense of it all. So all we can do is to acknowledge what has happened and to offer our support in love and prayer as we are doing this morning.

All this has been done out of a tortured belief that death, destruction, violence and mayhem are acceptable and necessary strategies on the long road of human history. The cross of Calvary is being carried throughout our world day by day on the streets of Belfast, here at home, on the streets of Manhattan, as I speak and throughout our troubled world mans inhumanity to man.

But we must never lose hope and our gathering here today is a real sign of hope. So in hope let us pray for those who have died, those who have been injured, those whose lives have been marred, disjointed or laid desolate. We ask God to give words to those leaders that even in the depths of despair and distress that they may find the words of peace.

We ask God to deepen our faith, just as the darkness of Calvary awaited the dawn of Easter morning, that the darkness of these days may lead to a new and lasting peace. May God be with those who are caught in the slip stream of this violence. May they experience God and healing in their lives and that the longing of peace in our world may become a reality for all people, religious and political traditions.

We live in a world of restless people. People driven by fear and by greed, caught up in a web of tension and of speed, driving themselves and our world as well into a future that none of us can foretell.

Oh God instead of vain driven people, fill our hearts and minds with true drive, inspired by faith in you and help us to build a world of true and lasting love.

**SAINTS THIS WEEK**

**25 Tuesday - St. Finbarr**, came to Loch Irce (Gougane Barra) and probably lived there as a hermit. When disciples gathered round him he moved to Cork at the mouth of the Lee, where he founded a monastery which became a famous centre of learning.  
**26 Wednesday - Sts Cosmas and Damian**, early martyrs in Syria, patrons of physicians, They are known as the Anargyri in the East, since they never took money for their medical services.  
**27 Thursday - St. Vincent de Paul**, 1580-1660, founded the Congregation of the Mission (the Vincentians) and the Daughters of Charity (1633) the first sisters to work outside their convents in active service. He is the patron of all charitable works.  
**28 Friday - St. Wenceslaus**, 905-925, Prince of Bohemia, killed by his brother. Patron of brewers.  
**St. Lawrence Ruiz and his companions**, During the period 1633-1637, sixteen martyrs, namely St. Lawrence Ruiz and his companions, shed their blood for Christ in the city of Nagasaki, Japan. This group of martyrs, members or associates of the Order of Preachers, includes nine priests, two religious and five lay people, one of whom is the Filipino husband and father, Lawrence Ruiz. They spread the Christian faith in the Phillipine Islands, Formosa and Japan sowing abundant seeds for the future of Christianity.

Jerusalem and the temple were destroyed by the Babylonian armies and the real exile began in 587-86BC. Jeremiah had prophesied throughout the exile that there would be a return to a glorious future. Cyrus, king of Persia, conquered Babylon in 539 and encouraged the exiles to return home and rebuild the temple.

*Lect II:327*

"Semitic languages in Jesus' time did not have a precise vocabulary for a wide range of family relationships. Rather they reflected a tribal background, where members of the same tribe, clan or family, were considered brothers and sisters, no matter what their precise relationship." The Greek terms used in the Gospel may have been influenced by early Christian references phrased in Aramaic or Hebrew. cf. R.E. Brown, SS 101 Questions on the Bible. Chapman 1991.

The joy of the return from Exile and the building of the Second Temple are memories of God's favour for his people.

**27 Thursday Hag. 1:1-8. Ps. 149. Lk. 9:7-9. Lect II:331**

The age of salvation, with the coming of the Lord and the setting up of his kingdom, is conditional on the rebuilding of the Temple.

**28 Friday Hag. 1:15-2:9. Ps. 42. Lk. 9:18-22. Lect II:333**  
The Temple signals the fulfilment of Israel's hopes.

**29 Saturday Dan. 7:9-10, 13-14. or Apoc. 12:7-12. Ps. 137. Jn. 1:47-51. Lect II:1205**

**Gabriel** brought the message to Mary at the Annunciation. (Patron of telecommunications, radio and TV workers).

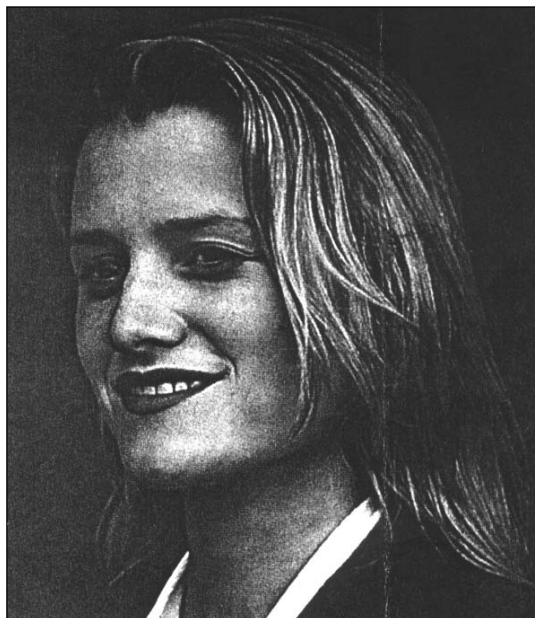

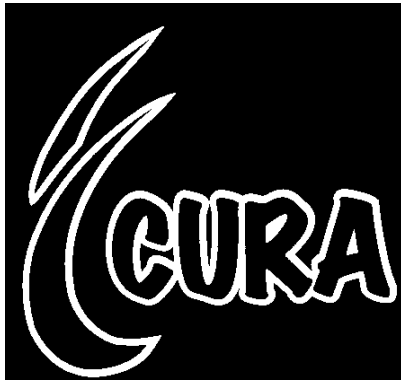
