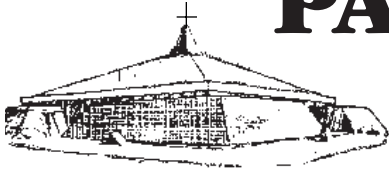

Our faith is so often put to the test not just by intellectual doubts but by the difficulties of life. the paradox is that it is only faith that will bring us to life through these trials. It is only faith that allows us to see beyond what we have already been given by God himself.

ISLAM

The religion of Islam, (meaning "submission to God's decree") was founded by Mohammed. He was born in Mecca in 570A.D. As a merchant he travelled to Syria and Palestine. In his fortieth year he claimed to have received a call from the Angel Gabriel to preach the worship of the one true God to his people, the Arabs. As a general and leader he crushed the warring factions of Arabia and welded them into a formidable state. After his death Islam aspired to become a world power and a universal religion. Within a century Palestine, Egypt, North Africa and the south of Spain all fell to the power of the Islamic sword. Later Persia, Afganistan and much of India were conquered. In the fifteenth century the Byzantine Empire was attacked and Constantinople fell to the power of Islam.

The attitude of the Catholic Church to Islam is best expressed by the document of the Vatican Council on its relationship with non-Christian Religions: "Upon the Moslems too the Church looks with esteem. They adore one God, Maker of heaven and earth. They strive to submit even to His inscrutable decrees, just as did Abraham. Though they do not acknowledge Jesus as God, they revere him as a prophet. They also honour Mary, His virgin mother; at times they call on her, too, with devotion. In addition they await the day of judgment when God will give each man his due after raising him up. Consequently, they prize the moral life and give worship to God especially through prayer, almsgiving and fasting.

Although in the course of the centuries many quarrels have arisen between Christians and Moslems, this most sacred Synod urges all to forget the past and to strive sincerely for mutual understanding. On behalf of all mankind, let them make common cause of safeguarding and fostering social justice, moral values, peace and freedom."

Students of the history of relations between Christians and Moslems will find this statement a remarkable change in the Church's approach. Equally surprising is how much Christians and Moslems actually have in common in their beliefs. It is surely on this shared heritage and belief in the one true God that harmony and understanding should be built between the followers of these two great religions.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

9 Tuesday - Sts. Denis, Rusticus and Eleutherius, were beheaded and thrown into the Seine in 258 and later buried at Montmartre. Denis, the first Bishop of Paris, is one the patrons of France. Their finest tribute is the abbey church of Saint-Denis where the kings of France are buried.

11 Thursday - St. Canice, was born in County Derry around 527 and died in 603. Though his people were poor, he studied at Clonard under Finnian and at Glasnevin under Mobhi. A deep friendship developed between himself and Colum Cille, with whom he worked for a time in Scotland, where he set up a number of churches.

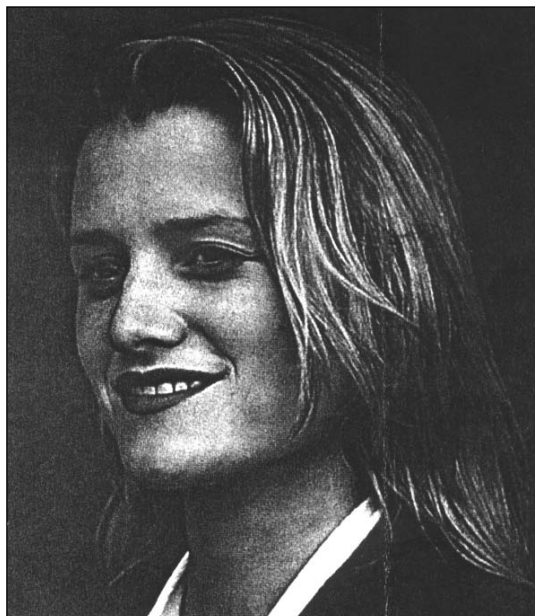
