These families are in fear of Christmas - they have nothing extra with which to buy presents for their children, nothing extra to buy a special Christmas dinner, nothing extra with which to celebrate, indeed, nothing to celebrate.

There are many families in our midst with only one parent, others where one parent drinks or gambles the family income, others again where the financial pressure of schoolgoing children often doesn't leave enough money for day to day food.

We have been in homes where the income isn't adequate to cope with the caring of the sick or elderly relative, homes where age and often lack of skills doesn't allow as bread winner to take up a job.

These are our families and the families for whom we make this appeal.

We wish to thank you for your generous support and look forward to it continuing. We would also like to especially thank our parish priest, Fr. Leonard O' Brien and the other Priests of the Parish for allowing the indoor collection this Saturday and Sunday and also for their quiet and unstinting support during another year.

FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT

2 Sunday Is.2:1-5. Ps. 121. Rom. 13:11-14. Mt. 24:37-44. *Lect I:3* The Liturgy of the day directs our minds to the Last Day, to the second Coming of Christ, to the Day of Judgment. We look at this not as individuals, but as a great gathering of all peoples. the suddenness of the coming of the Lord may make us fear, but we should look forward in joy. Rejoice when we hear them say "Let us go to God's house". St. Paul tells us how to live in the meantime; be fully awake and cast off the works of darkness

3 Monday Is.2:1-5. Ps. 121. Mt 8:5-11. Lect I:10

On these first days of Advent the Gospel passage is chosen in consideration of the selected texts from Isaiah. "For this reason the Church, especially during Advent and Lent and above all at Easter Vigil, re-reads and re-lives the great events of salvation history in the "today" of her liturgy. But this also demands that cathechesis help the faithful to open themselves to this spiritual understanding of the economy of salvation as the Church's liturgy reveals it and enables us to live it" (CCI)105 liturgy reveals it and enables us to live it".CCC1095

4 Tuesday Is.11:1-10. Ps. 71. Lk 10:21-24. Lect I:13 The prophet speaks of the one on whom the spirit rests. Integrity and faithfulness shall charactise him. And in those days there shall be peace.

5 Wednesday Is. 25:6-10. Ps. 22. Mt 15:29-37. Lect I:15 Isaiah prophecies the banquet on the heavenly mount when all tears will be wiped away. Christ on the hillside provides bread for the people who are astonished at the Massianic signs. In the Eucharist we have a foretaste of the heavenly banquet.

6 Thursday Is.26:1-6. Ps. 117. Mt 7:21,24-27. Lect 1:18 It is the upright nation, the faithful people, that will enter the kingdom. To be part of that people, each one must hear the word of God and do God's will.

7 Friday Is.29:17-24. Ps. 26. Mt 9:27-31. Lect I:20

One of the signs of the Day of the Lord is that the eyes of the blind will see. Jesus cures the two blind men because of their faith in him. In Christ, the true light, we can truly see, have vision, discern with wisdom. 8 Saturday Gen.3:9-15,20. Ps. 97. Eph. 1:3-6,11-12. Lk.1:26-38. Lect 1:20

God will permit a period of distress for a limited time, but after that will come a time of relief for his faithful people. Jesus warns us to hold fast during the days of trial and be ready for his coming to receive the sovereignty.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

3 Monday - St. Francis Xavier, 1506-1552, one of the first seven Jesuits, was sent to India by St. Ignatius. He converted many in Goa. He had greater difficulty in Japan, and died as he attempted to enter China. A patron of the missions.

4 Tuesday - St. John Damascene, c. 675-749, was a Syrian Christian theologian. He became a priest in the monestery of Saint Sabas near Jerusalem and was a leading figure in the defence of icons in the iconast

6 Thursday - St. Nicholas of Myra, a fourth-century bishop in Turkey, of whom little is known. He is patron of Russia, of sailors, of pawnbrokers

and of children.
7 Friday - St. Ambrose, 339-397, became governor of the Roman
Province, whose seat was in Milan. In 374, the laity insisted on his
becoming bishop though he was still not baptised. He defended
orthodoxy in brilliant preaching. Patron of Milan, beekeepers, domestic
animals, French Commissariat.

JUST ANOTHER STORY!

(or Turkey and Ham)

At first it may seem another of those stories produced to wrench your heart, jerk a tear or more likely make you fish into your wallet for some change. The usual Christmas fare, as predictable as turkey and ham, but what this is all about is human dignity and lots and lots of courage, dedication, care and love right in the city of Cork.

For instance it takes courage to face life after eighteen years confined in a mental institution, or to believe in your abilities after being knocked down by all those who are supposed to foster your growth and well being.

It is tough to be tagged by society as mentally handicapped if not worse! Our story is about such people, people who have found hope and are coping with their lives trying to find healing by sharing their lives with others in communities and homes, trying to live and work like everybody else.

The L'Arche (French for Ark) community was founded back in 1964 by Jean Vanier a Canadian philosopher who believes in the healing power of love and the dignity of the human person. This philosophy is translated into practice by welcoming people with mental handicaps and giving them a home and scope for living. Not just an institution but a home where all are treated equally and their potential respected.

In Cork, the L'Arche community was opened back in 1985 and there are now, sixteen years later, five L'Arche houses and a workshop/daycare Center.

At the workshop more than twenty people with learning difficulties work along with assistants or helpers, some of whom are funded through community employment (F.A.S.). Apart from therapy and life skills, various crafts are taught, and it is amazing to see the dignity with which these people work despite their problems, challenges and difficulties. The amount of first class manufactured products has to be seen to be believed.

Weaving artifacts, colourful candles, beautiful batik cards and paintings, dried flowers and carpentry items like wooden clocks, cassette racks and a variety of furniture. To experience all this for yourself and perhaps lessen the stress of Christmas shopping you are warmly invited to a Christmas Fair to be held on

SUNDAY 9TH, DECEMBER FROM 10.00AM TO 5.00PM in THE L'ARCHE COMMUNITY

in Togher, nicely sandwiched between the Church and the National School.

Come and see for yourself what christmas is really about.
