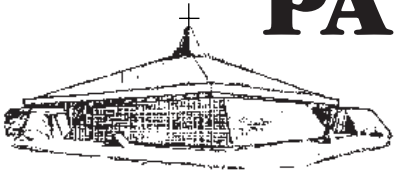

PEACE ON EARTH

Some years are remembered by images that are so forceful that they blot out all the other news stories that make up the daily record of world affairs. The year that has past will be remembered by the television pictures of crumbling twin towers and, in Ireland, the faces of crying school girls in Belfast making their way to school through a jeering mob. The birth of the new century had brought hopes of peace to a world wearied of the continuous wars of the nineteen hundreds. Those high hopes were cruelly dashed by the events of 2001. If we are to learn anything from these events it is that the struggle for peace must go on through every century, through every year, indeed through every day. John Philpot Curran once said that eternal vigilance was the price of freedom. It is much the same with the preservation of peace. Even within the family itself, one careless comment, one hurtful remark, and the insult can get stitched into the memory for all time. Peace can be shattered in a moment. Peace can take years to build up.

The peace process in the North is proof that the efforts of good men and women can triumph in the end. It is not that many years ago when the big news at Christmas was that there would be a ceasefire for a few days during the Christmas season. In those days a total ceasefire seemed an impossible dream, a shared government seemed sheer fantasy. Yet that is now a reality thanks to the unrelenting commitment of decent people.

The Christmas Angels' promise of peace was not unconditional: peace was promised to "men of good will". So it really comes down to our own dispositions. Either we are for violence, injustice, quarrelling, hatred, revenge and all the other evils that we learned were opposed to the fifth commandment or else we take as our model the Infant Jesus who was born in the humble surroundings of the stable and lived and died as a man of peace.

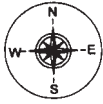

A holy night, a silent night, with Mother and child, all is calm, all is bright. This inspiring hymn came to us because an organ in Germany broke down about one hundred years ago. Without an organ the parish priest in a small country church said it would be a 'SilentNight'. The organist would compose a melody. The priest would write the lyrics and the choir would just sing the soft praises of this hymn for Midnight Mass. That is all it was meant to be, just a simple hymn sung once and forgotten. Then a snowstorm prevented the man who fixed the organ from coming until the snow melted in the spring. After he finished he noticed the music left on the organ since Christmas night and took it back to Munich. The rest is history. "Silent Night" has reverberated throughout the ages. With its quiet sounds of love and peace it has inspired millions and millions, touching the lives of countless people.
