Children's Mass

Sunday October 19th, the 11.00 am Mass in Christ our Light Church marked the beginning of trying to involve children in our Sunday Mass. The principals and staff of the primary schools of the parish were very helpful and supportive in helping members of the Parish council invite parents to bring second and third class children to the eleven o'clock Mass at Christ Our Light church. A notable feature was the number of parents and second level pupils who offered to help with the organising. Sunday morning dawned bright and clear; soon after ten thirty parents began to arrive at Christ Our Light with their children, when the children were welcomed at the start of Mass more than eighty wanted to be involved in the crying room listening, drawing and colouring and all the time discovering the Good News in terms and language that made sense to these young people. Naturally there were some teething problems - colouring pencils might be better than crayons; the length of time is short; parents not sure what room the activity was taking place in; children having slight difficulties locating their parents in church when returning after sign of peace.

All in all a very good beginning and the activity will be continued at the 11.00 a.m. mass each Sunday in Christ Our Light; the continuing support of parents and second level pupils is also vital. There are several add-ons as we continue e.g. some music and singing; interactive ways of handing on the Good news opens up many possibilities.

Today's gospel is the restoring of sight to the blind beggar Bartimaeus; the children are asked to IMAGINE if you were a child who could not see, what things would you miss from the garden.

Jesus wants us to LOOK out for others, They may need some help.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Blessed Dominic Collins 31-October-2003 Dominic Collins was born around 1566 in the town of Youghal, Co. Cork. In 1598, after a military career, he entered the Society of Jesus as a Brother. He returned to Ireland in 1601, but on the 16th June 1602, he was captured by the English who tried in vain to make him abjure his faith. Condemned to death, he was hanged in his native town on 31st October 1602.

Feast Of All Saints 01-November-2003
Saints are the real historical proof of God's love for us and the possibility of personal transformation, which that same love promises. In recalling the lives of these people of prayer we are challenged by them. Saints lived at a particular time in history with its own special temptations and challenges such as wholesale drift from the Church as happened during the Reformation, or religious persecution, or the lure of riches at times of prosperity. In their spiritual lives they worked out how to live out the Christian life in the face of the challenges of the time. As Catholics in today's world we too face challenges quite different from those of previous generations. Our own salvation depends on how we meet those challenges.
