Holy Week is a very different week in the Churches calendar. Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week are each given their individual title; times and schedules in each church are changed and this leads to some confusion for many people trying to attend the various ceremonies. During Sunday evening April 4th I went to see the film' The Passion of the Christ'; the film is well worth seeing and is a powerful presentation of Christ's passion and some occasions in His life by the use of 'flashbacks'. However the film ends with Christ's death on the cross and if that were the complete event HIS life would have been an utter waste of time.

Today we celebrate Easter Sunday, the empty tomb is the big news and the initial disappointment gradually fades away when the various accounts of sightings and some words of reassurance are heard - then a thrilling joy breaks out. Christ has gone down into the valley of death and has trampled death underfoot. Christ has risen on the third day -- -- 'we look for the Resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come', this is the core of our faith. The various accounts of the apparitions of the risen Christ all end with an exhortation to reject disbelief and announce that Jesus is beyond the power of death.

The Easter faith, born of doubt resolved, is a continuing act of freedom which says; 'It is really he, he is alive! '. This is the challenge of Easter to us the body of Christ, risen and exalted at the right hand of the Father.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 10:34. 37-43

Peter preaches to some of the early converts and tells them of Christ's death and Resurrection. That message is still preached today, within the Church. We yearn to hear the truth, the Gospel, the Word of life.

On Friday afternoon when Jesus died, the women had not been able to finish the customary preparation for burial. The Sabbath began at sundown on Friday, so Mary of Magdala hurried to the tomb Sunday morning to complete her task. She found the tomb empty. Certain that Jesus' body had been stolen, she ran back to get the other disciples. Peter and the other disciple also found an empty tomb but with Jesus' clothing rolled neatly and placed where his body had been. The disciples still didn't understand about the resurrection and Mary wept. As she cried, two angels appeared asking why she was crying. She then saw a gardener and asked him where the body might be. When he called her by name, Mary immediately recognised Jesus

SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint Bernadette 16-April-2004

In 1858 Our Lady appeared in Lourdes to a poor fourteen-year-old girl named Bernadette. Eighteen apparitions in all took place, the last on the sixteenth of July in the same year. On one of these occasions "the beautiful Lady" told the child to tell the priests she wished a chapel to be built on the spot and processions to be made to the grotto. Soon Lourdes became one of the most popular places of pilgrimage in the world bringing cures to many sick people and hope to all afflicted with infirmity. Bernadette herself became a nun and her name has been given to many girls in Baptism and many more take the name Bernadette for their Confirmation.
