THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 5:12-16

The earliest days of the Christian community existed in a period of harmony and success in preaching the Gospel. Like Jesus, the followers are able to heal the sick and those possessed by demons. They continue to gather for prayer near the temple of Jerusalem.

Second Reading: Apoc. 1:9-13. 17-19

The vision of Christ is a source of joy; he brings us divine mercy in person. Like John the Apostle, we welcome the sight of the Lord. Jesus Christ is risen, our light and our life. Gospel: John 20:19-31

Following Jesus' crucifixion the disciples were still uncertain of his message. They lost hope, were filled with fear, and locked themselves in a room. Without entering through the door, Jesus appeared before them with a greeting of peace and a mission to spread the Good News. The disciple, Thomas, was not in the room. When he learned of Jesus' visit, he would not believe it. But about a week later, Jesus appeared in a similar way and Thomas was with the others. Jesus invited Thomas to touch the wounds in his hands and side. Thomas knew immediately that it was Jesus and believed in him.

SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint George 23-April-2004

Patron of England, was probably martyred at Lydda, now Lod in Israel, during the persecutions of Diocletian, Pilgrims visited his tomb at Lydda in the fifth century, and a monastery in Jerusalem bore his name. His martyrdom was known in England in Anglo-Saxon times, and the Crusaders brought a fresh devotion to him back after the First Crusade.

A vision of St George and St Demetrius was said to have resulted in the defeat of the Saracen army at the time of the siege of Antioch. He became the patron of soldiers, and Richard I is said to have placed his army under St George's special protection. Whether Henry V cried 'God for England, Harry and St George!' as he does in Shakespeare's play is not certain, but it is a fact that after the battle of Agincourt, St George's commemoration was raised to the status of a major feast. Edward III made George the patron of the Order of the Garter, and St George's Chapel, Windsor, is dedicated in his name. He had become an honorary Englishman. It was probably inevitable that a legend should develop that he had visited England from Ireland, and this seems to be the origin of the name 'St George's Channel' for the Irish Sea. George's cult came to embody the ideal of Christian chivalry. Though he did not, as far as we know, slay a dragon and rescue a maiden (there are various interpretations of this legend), he is also a patron of Russia, Venice, Genoa, Portugal, Aragon, Lithuania and Boy Scouts, he is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers of medieval European tradition, and he is even mentioned in Islamic tradition.


