Lenten Journey

This year Lent arrives very early; next Wednesday 9th of February is Ash Wednesday. So as well as trying to get some ashes on Ash Wednesday what else might I do for Lent 2005. Maybe I will do without certain foods, alcohol or gambling? I might do some extra things - good works, say more prayers or some other activity. I could give some extra money for good causes or to a poor box.

Another line of thought is that perhaps I could cut down on things. Prune our life of excess activity and excess involvement. We could do more spiritual reading, study the bible or set a time aside for meditation. All these actions or inactions are based on good intentions and the thinking behind them is based on the traditional teaching that Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and abstinence. Yet Lent often leaves us as it finds us, perhaps even a little weary of trying to be a Christian. How can we avoid that disabling after-effect this lent. How can we find new hope, new meaning in our lives during this season, which will inspire and encourage us during the months ahead?

I suggest that to help us in developing our relationship with God that we turn to the New Testament. In the New Testament we find God's full response to his people - he sends his Son Jesus Christ not only to reassure us of his love and involvement with us, but also to show us how to be fully human. In Jesus, we see the completion of the purpose of our life; it is to become like him, fully human, fully divine, one with God. That is what we are called to, that is what we are created for. Jesus shows us how to live, how to conduct our relationships, how to treat other people. Jesus shows us what our priorities are to be and where we should invest our time and attention. Every time our actions, our behaviour or our lifestyle cannot find a reflection in Christ's life and behaviour it means we are less than human; we are incomplete human beings.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10

Isaiah propheisied: Share bread with the hungry. Shelter the homeless. Clothe the naked. Do not turn away from your own. "Then your light shall break forth like the dawn."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul's teaching did not come from himself but from the convincing power of the Spirit. So the faith he passed on rests "not on human wisdom but on the power of God."

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16.

It is common for us in our times to be careful about the salt we use. However, in Jesus' day, salt was a very important commodity. It was used to pay salaries. Like us, people used salt to flavor food. But, because there was no refrigeration, salt was also used to preserve food. That is why, when Jesus called his disciples "salt" and "light," he declared their great importance. What was of significant importance to Jesus was the enthusiasm with which the disciples spread the Good News.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Gobnait 11-February-2005

Saint Gobnait is one of the best loved saints in West Cork but only traditions concerning her life survive. The main part of her life was spent in Ballyvourney, Co Cork, where there has always been a deep devotion to her, and which is a place of pilgrimage on February 11th and on Pentecost. Her gifts of caring for and curing the sick have been a significant part of her cult through the centuries.

A number of magical stories are related about her. She was told by an angel that she would find "the place of her resurrection" where she saw nine white deer together, and she travelled along the south western coast of Ireland looking for this place - and founding religious sites as she went - until she saw the sign in Ballyvourney. Here she established a monastery.

She is said to have driven away invaders by loosing her bees on them, and to have prevented an undesirable intruder from building his castle in the neighbourhood by each night throwing a round stone across the valley at the building, which would knock down the walls and then bounce back to her. This round stone is said to be still visible embedded in the wall of her church.

Happily her memorial coincides with the World Day for the Sick.
