The Pope and Islam

There has been a pattern of late that western culture has been perceived to cause offence to Islamic culture, particularly to those that could perhaps be categorised as the more fundamental of the Muslim world. Remember the Danish cartoons that caused such outrage earlier this year? These cartoons poked fun at the Prophet Mohammed. Satire and poking fun is tolerated, if not always happily accepted, in the west, but for many Muslims this was deeply offensive.

Once could ask of course how cartoons from an obscure Danish publication came to be reprinted globally, particularly in countries where it was known they would inflame anger? There is more than a hint of a mischievous agenda going on here.

In the frenzy and riots that ensued 140 people were killed and scores injured from Afghanistan to India to Syria and Indonesia. Denmark was targeted and embassies burned. This clash of civilizations is not a clash of Christians v Muslims, but more a clash between nations where freedom of religion and religious tolerance is accepted and ones where there is religious intolerance.

The Catholic position as defined by Vatican II, is one of "high regard for Muslims" and urges a "sincere effort to achieve mutual understanding." (Nostra Aetate, '65)

The fact that a very lengthy lecture by Pope Benedict, to an academic audience in the University of Regensburg, (where he was once professor) has grabbed global attention is not a surprise. But the fact that the many other speeches he has made during his German visit have gone practically unreported is more surprising. The pope's lecture at Resenburg was about "Faith, Reason and Rationality".

What did he really say that caused offence? Did the pope really insult Muslims? Well some Muslim leaders were very quick to cry fowl. The pope was making a point in showing the fundamental contradiction between religion and holy war. He quoted a Byzantine Emperor to illustrate his point and this is what led to the outcry from sections of the Islamic world. Benedict's overall point is valid: any religion that tries to use force "the sword," to convert followers goes against the nature of God. This applies to Christianity and Islam and any other religion.

It would be a valid entry point to debate and dialogue between the Muslim and Christian worlds. However the reaction from many sectors has led to riots, firebombing churches and inflamed language from Muslim political and clerical leaders. The Vatican initially, and then the pope personally responded with an apology stating that there was no intention to cause offence. This apology was graciously received by the resident Theologian at the Islamic Cultural Centre in Dublin.

There is a lesson for all of us to be sensitive and respectful to other people's religious beliefs and be open to dialogue and understanding. Luckily we live in a democratic society of religious diversity and tolerance. Ironically these freedoms are not enjoyed by the peoples of many Muslim nations.

We remember names like Brendan and Colman from the distant past but we also bring to mind more recent names like Edel Quinn of Kanturk and the late Bishop Courtney of Tipperary. Our own Cork Diocese supported the Peru Mission from 1965 – 2004.
