Luke's Gospel

The following were some of the issues that concerned the Christian community during the period that Luke came to write his gospel. They desired to be viewed as good citizens of Rome and wished to show that Christianity was not a threat to the empire.

How could Jesus' words half a century earlier be appropriate to a gentile audience living in a very different situation? Why would Greeks / Gentiles accept a religion with such a Jewish core?

The people of Israel are the chosen people of God, where do gentiles fit into God's plan of salvation?

Luke addressed these questions in a number of ways; he carefully portrayed Roman officials in a positive way. Jesus heals the Centurion's (a Roman official) servant in Luke and also praises the official's faith. Pilate declares Jesus innocent three times in this gospel. The Roman centurion at Calvary, declares that" Truly this man was innocent". The combined effect is to seek to assure Roman citizens that there is nothing to fear in Christianity.

Luke's gospel presents Christianity as a universal faith by assuring its gentile readers that they are included from the very beginning in the salvation that God brings in Jesus. Christianity is a religion that is intended for "all nations". The angels announce a message of joy for all peoples. Simeon speaks of the salvation that the child is to bring to all peoples and that will be a light of revelation to the gentiles. Luke wants his readers to know that they had been included in God's plan of salvation from the beginning.

Today - World Day of The Sick

In 1992 Pope John Paul II instituted the World Day of the Sick to be held each year on the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

'The World Day of the Sick - in its preparation, realisation and objectives – is not meant to be reduced to a mere external display centring on certain initiatives, however praiseworthy the may be, but is intended to reach consciences to make them aware of the valuable contribution which human and Christian service to those suffering makes to better understanding among people and, consequently, to building real peace.

Indeed, peace presupposes, as its preliminary condition, that special attention be reserved for the suffering and the sick by public authorities, national and international organisations, and every person of good will. This is valid, first of all, for developing countries - in Latin America, Africa, and Asia - which are marked by serious deficiencies in health care. With the celebration of the World Day of the Sick, the Church is promoting a renewed commitment to those populations, seeking to wipe out the injustice existing today by devoting greater human, spiritual, and material resources to their needs' (Message of Pope John Paul II for 1st World Day of the Sick, 1993-94).
