Holy Week

From Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, the Church remembers the journey of Jesus from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his last meal, trial, crucifixion, death, and resurrection. These are important events in our faith journey. Throughout the week we are reminded of God's great love for us.

Each Holy Thursday we remember the institution of the Eucharist, which gives us nourishment for our journey. We also recall Jesus washing the Apostles' feet and his words: 'If I then, the Lord and Master, have washed your feet, then surely you must wash one another's feet.' In washing the feet of his apostles Jesus gave us an example of humility and showed how love and service are expressed in action. He now invites us to demonstrate that love and service towards each other. Perhaps this is a time to ask oneself, in what ways am I the hands, the feet, the eyes of Christ for others? In ministering to one another we deepen our solidarity as members of the Body of Christ.

To those in our Parish community who are housebound or resident in Nursing Homes, because of age, illness or for whatever reason, I would like to say that you too have an active role in ministering to others by the precious contribution you make through your sufferings and by your ministry of prayer.

On Holy Thursday morning, the Mass of Chrism will be celebrated at the Cathedral during which the Holy Oils to be used for the celebration of the Sacraments will be blessed. These are the Oil of Catechumens, (Baptism); the Oil of the Sick; the Oil of Chrism (Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination). Bishop Buckley has invited us to join with him and the priests of the Diocese for this celebration. On this day when we also recall the institution of the Priesthood, let us remember in prayer the priests of our Parish in gratitude for their commitment and ministry to us.

After the Eucharistic Celebration on Holy Thursday evening, the Blessed Sacrament is carried to the altar of Repose which reminds us of Jesus' time in the garden of Gethsemane and recalls his question to the disciples: 'Could you not watch one hour with me'? Psalm 116 asks, "How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good he has done for me?" The word, "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving." Spending some time before the blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose gives us an opportunity to reflect on all the reasons we have to be grateful to God and to pray for the suffering members of our Parish community.

Let us journey with Christ and each other throughout this Holy Week.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

Processional Gospel: Luke 19:28-40

A line of poetry sums up the paradox of the events proclaimed today, "They stripped the trees to greet her son, and then hung him, stripped upon a tree." This first gospel tells of Jesus' triumphal entrance into the city of Jerusalem. Only he knew of his fate that we study in the reading of the Passion today.

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

While reading this passage, realize that God has blessed you in a special way. However, this special blessing will also bring some pain. Endurance of this pain requires that we remain faithful. Recall a time that you remained loyal despite misunderstanding and abuse.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul proclaims to the Philippians that through Christ's dying and rising comes victory for us all. Jesus is Lord.

Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56.

This year we hear Luke's account of Jesus' Passion beginning with the Last Supper which for Luke, shows signs of the heavenly banquet. During the meal, Jesus predicted but did not name his betrayer. Following the meal, all the disciples went with Jesus to the Mount of Olives to pray. There Jesus was, indeed, handed over by Judas to the Jewish leaders. In retaliation, a disciple cut off a servant's ear, but Jesus touched the ear and healed him. Jesus went before the high priest in whose courtyard Peter denied Jesus the three times predicted at supper. At daybreak, Jesus went before the Sanhedrin and on to Pilate, to Herod, and back to Pilate who tried to release Jesus to the crowds. Pilate did not find Jesus guilty of anything, but the crowd pressed for the release of Barabbas and the crucifixion of Jesus. Jesus was led to the cross, helped by Simon, mourned by the women of Jerusalem, and taunted by the Roman soldiers. When at last Jesus died, a man named Joseph gave up his tomb so that Jesus would not be buried in a common grave of criminals.

49th Cork Ballincollig Scout Group

Last weekend saw all the sections out, the scouts went to squelch in Farran woods, and the Friday night Macoimh went to Mullinhassig and the Tuesday night Macoimh were in Castlefreke.

The Scouts went to Farran woods where the Scouts and Guides in Cork organised the activity. There were 10 bases around the woods, which included, the slippery mudslide, the water challenge, obstacle course and many more, one muddier than the next. The Scouts got very muddy and very wet. The Macoimh made their way to the Beach and in their Clons lit fires, after word's they climbed the dunes and went dune surfing. After cleaning up the site they made their way back to the bus.

In today's gospel reading, we travel with Jesus as he moves from being acclaimed by the crowds for his good works, to being rejected and despised. How did it feel to be rejected for speaking the truth and proclaiming the word of God? It's hard, understanding the motivations of the crowds who could welcome him one week and reject him the next, or is it? Are there times when we have been as inconsistent? Welcoming someone we meet, then speaking against them when it suits us. Holding particular values and beliefs, then failing to stand by them because we don't want to stand out from the crowd. Even putting our own needs and desires first so we can have extra, even if it leaves others with nothing. Today's gospel challenges us to think about where we would have stood on Good Friday. Would we stay with Jesus, or hide in the crowd? This week marks the 40th anniversary of Populorum Progressio, a papal encyclical on human development, which challenges us all to stand by the poor and rejected in our world, regardless of the price it might cost to us.
