Most of us have the faith to turn to Christ when we are in need, but our faith often has to survive the negative voices around us, that would make out that he is indifferent to our needs. We see him today as the Saviour, who cares for our immediate as well as our ultimate needs.

Eyes of Faith

The Mass readings for this thirtieth Sunday of ordinary time speak of salvation, of Jesus who saves, of the promises of God, promises of comfort, restoration and life. And they speak of faith. There have always been examples of weak faith (most of us, perhaps), deep faith and no faith, but nowadays we see open opposition to faith and a manifest and honest struggle between faith and scepticism in many people. We no longer live in an age of faith.

We need to call out from our pain, but to whom? We pray for the grace given to Bartimaeus to recognise our salvation when Jesus of Nazareth is close by. Bartimaeus called out from the margins of poverty, helplessness and blindness, a nobody and an embarrassment to those nearby. The blind man looked to Jesus with eyes of faith. And as we cry to God from the spiritual margins, from our lack of faith or weak faith and ask for mercy, we too will be heard. We remind ourselves that our faith is not merely a question of intellectual assent; it is a relationship with the risen Jesus, with Jesus who said to Bartimaeus "your faith has saved you." Faith can be transforming, it can change us for the better and give us joy, as well as give us hope in the most difficult times in our lives.

Jesus our High Priest has a real sympathy for us and identifies with us. We call to him from our spiritual blindness and poverty, calling over the negative voices which surround us and which deny faith, deny hope and deny life. "Your faith has saved you," we ask for the faith that saves. The Holy Spirit assures us that in the end, all will indeed be well. God's promises will be realised, promises of comfort and consolation, of restoration of all we have lost. We will be led to streams of living water. As we call out to God we are in turn called by God to share in the priesthood of Christ and we are sent to the lost, to those who have lost their faith. With Bartimaeus we follow Jesus on the road to Jerusalem, seeing him and other with the eyes of faith, eyes of love.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9
 Today's reading tells us to exult, that God has gathered and saved his people.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6
 We are told of the selection of the Priest as mediator between God and man.

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52
 Today's gospel the restoring of his sight to the blind beggar. His sight is restored to Bartimaeus but just as important he becomes the symbol of "those who dwelt in darkness and in the shadow of death". Bartimaeus expresses his conviction by his repeated cries, by his leap of faith which makes him reject every support and takes him towards the one who calls him and is going to heal him. No sooner is he cured than Bartimaeus gets ready to follow Jesus on the way, his cure leads him to conversion and type of model disciple.

Scout News
