Baptism of Jesus 2010

During the year 2009 two hundred and sixty nine children were baptised in the parish of Ballincollig. This means that two hundred and sixty nine families brought their children for baptism, many of those parents accepted the invitation to come along to a baptism preparation course during the year.

The sacrament of Baptism is the first step for all of us in answering the call of Christ "Come follow me". Baptism is about accepting the call to be a disciple of Jesus. Baptism is an important family occasion but it is also the beginning of many days following Christ. Parents are reminded in the rite of Baptism that they are responsible for helping their daughter or son to grow in love of God and our neighbour.

What does following Christ mean to the ordinary person? It means to be a Christian in your home, your neighbourhood and your work. Christianity is about how to live not just what to believe. Faith has to be translated into action. Don't bother proclaiming that you believe unless you act accordingly'.

The Christian vision inspires sacrifice and service of others. The task is not one for the individual Christian only but for the Christian community as a whole. It is easier to witness as a member of a supporting community. At our baptism we are welcomed into a believing community. The baptism of Christ reminds us of our baptism and provides us with an opportunity to commit ourselves once again to the Christian way of life.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: IS. 40:1-5, 9-11

The passage from Isaiah which forms today's first Scripture reading is one of the songs of the servant which is found in Isaiah. It describes the ideal Jew, the servant of God who will bring justice and light to the world and save his people. This servant is Christ.

Second Reading: Titus 2:11-14,3:4-7

The second Scripture passage is the conclusion of an episode in which Peter has a vision. In the vision he is instructed to receive into the infant Church not only Jews, but the whole world.

Gospel: Lk. 3:15-16. 21-22

People in the crowds wondered if John the Baptist was the Messiah. Luke provided a direct question and response to make clear that John understood he was not the Messiah. Luke removed the attention completely from John by not even making it clear whether or not John was present at Jesus' baptism. For Luke, John was the last prophet from the old age. Jesus marked the beginning of a new age. Luke was the only evangelist to have Jesus praying when the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, came down on Jesus while a voice from heaven proclaimed him as God's beloved Son.

Safety Tips

For driving in severe winter weather.

Tyres: Ensure your tyres are inflated correctly and that you have a minimum of 3 mm of tread on your tyres to cope with wet and slippery conditions.

Battery: In winter, the battery will run down quicker than in warmer weather. Make sure you do a regular long journey to top it up or trickle-charge the battery.

Engine: Modern engines are more robust than older ones. All the same, depress the clutch when starting as this will reduce drag on the engine when starting, and preserve the battery.

Screenwash: Keep this topped up and use a proper additive at the right concentration to prevent it freezing.

Emergency Kit: Jump leads, Sand, shovel, Ice scraper/de icing materials, Warm clothes, Torch, Food and water, First Aid kit, Mobile phone, Sturdy boots.

Fuel: Keep your tank topped up, that way if you are caught out, you'll have enough fuel to make it home or run the engine to keep warm. However, it's essential to keep snow from blocking the exhaust as noxious fumes can leak into the vehicle.

Windows: Clear all snow and ice from the windscreen before driving. Don't use water to de-ice windscreens. Hot water can crack the glass, and the water will only freeze again on the screen or on the ground where you're standing.

Locks: A squirt of WD-40 will prevent your door locks freezing up.

Warm clothing: Your car may be as warm as toast on the inside but if you have to step outside, you could be in trouble if you haven't got any warm clothing with you.

Always pack the following: warm coat, hat, gloves, sturdy boots, a blanket to keep you warm if you get stuck. Take some food, chocolate, biscuits, water and a hot drink if you can. Always carry a fully charged mobile, and some old bits of carpet to put under the tyres when stuck and a shovel to others. Don't rely on it.
