Trust In God

Today's readings encourage us to persevere in prayer even when all seems against us. After their deliverance from the slavery of Egypt, God asked Moses to lead his people to the Promised Land. Even though they had to face up to hardship and battles, it was Moses' continual reminder to them that their God was with them which helped them through all they had to endure. In the first reading, Moses sends Joshua to battle with the Amalekites while he goes to the top of a hill to pray. When Moses becomes weary, his companions, Aaron and Hur, support him in keeping his arms raised to God in prayer. Moses could not do it alone. How often we too support others, or experience the support of others, in prayer.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. Many of us can become discouraged when it seems our prayers are not being answered. Some of us may be a little impatient and want quick responses! When Jesus tells us to pray always and never to lose heart he wants us to put our trust in God who is always there for us in the ups and downs of our daily lives. God knows our needs even before we ask him. While he may not answer our prayers as we would wish, we can depend on him to do what is right for us. If an unjust judge can respond to the continual demands of the determined widow, how much more will our God, who is just and loving, respond to our prayers, perhaps in ways we do not expect. The Lord addresses a challenging question to each of us in today's Gospel: 'when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?' It is so easy to 'lose heart' and drift away from prayer especially when we're going through a difficult time. Jesus encourages us to remain faithful to God in prayer and not to 'give up' when the going gets tough.

In his letter to Timothy, St Paul highlights the important role the word of God has in guiding our lives. All Scripture is inspired by God and from it we 'learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus'. Let us nurture our faith by spending time each day in prayer and in reflecting on the word of God in Scripture. The Psalmist tells us that 'The Lord will guard you from evil, he will guard your soul. The Lord will guard your going and coming both now and for ever'. Knowing that God is always caring for us, let us continue to place our trust in him.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Exodus17: 8 - 13

The first reading for today gives an example of persistence in prayer. As long as Moses continued to pray, the Jews were victorious in battle; when he stopped praying, they began to lose.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14 - 4:2

In the second reading, Paul tells Timothy, the bishop, to remain faithful to his teachers and to Scripture. We, too, must be faithful to tradition and revelation.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Like a relentless child, the widow in Jesus' parable wouldn't give up. She continually begged the judge for justice against her opponents. Not because the judge wanted to see justice done, but because he grew tired of the woman's pleading, he granted her request. The point Jesus wanted to make with this story is how much our loving God will answer our prayers if we persist in our asking.

History Society
