Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Each year we celebrate a week of prayer for Christian Unity from 18th to 25th January. This year the Churches of Jerusalem prepared the material for this week of prayer and the chosen Theme is taken from the Acts of the Apostles: 'They were faithful to the teaching of the apostles, the common life of sharing, the breaking of bread and the prayers' (2.42). Within this Theme, four elements are presented which were marks of the early Church. Firstly, the Word of God delivered through the teaching of the apostles reminds us that, whatever our divisions, these teachings urge us to devote ourselves in love to each other, and in faithfulness to the one body which is the Church. The second element emphasises sharing: Just as the early Christians held all things in common, we too are called to share goods and burdens with generous hearts, so that nobody stays in need. The third element of unity, the Breaking of Bread, joins us in hope. Our unity goes beyond Holy Communion; it must include a right attitude towards everyone and towards ethical living. Fourthly, we draw strength from spending time in prayer. The Lord's Prayer calls all of us throughout the world, the weak and the mighty, to work together for justice, peace and unity that God's Kingdom may come.

These four elements are the pillars of the life of the church, and of its unity, and are essential to the life of the Christian community everywhere today. This Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a time when many local churches of various traditions get together and hold joint services, prayer meetings and fellowship. The Christians of Jerusalem invite us to pray with them for the unity of the Church and for justice and peace in the Holy Land and throughout the world

In today's Gospel John the Baptist recognises that the time is coming for him to hand his ministry on to One greater than himself. He introduces his own disciples to Jesus. Seeing Jesus coming towards him, he said: 'look there is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world'. John is the first person who leads others to Jesus whom he identifies as the Chosen One of God. In the second reading we see St Paul introducing the 'Good News' to the people of Corinth, addressing them as the holy people of Jesus Christ. We too have the 'Good News' to share. In the first reading from Isaiah, God is calling Israel to do something great. He wants them to be a light to the nations. Today we are called to be his messenger, to share our faith with those around us and to lead others to God. In the words of today's Psalm let our response be: 'Here I am Lord, I come to do your will'.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

The Lord said, "You are my servant, Israel, through whom I show my glory. . . . I will make you a light to the nations that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

"Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus," greeted the holy people of the Corinthian church with God's grace and peace. He addressed them as "sanctified in Christ Jesus."

Gospel: John 1:29-34.

John the Baptist knew Jesus as his cousin, but it is not clear until we read today's Gospel that John recognised Jesus as the promised Messiah. John called Jesus the "Lamb of God." We are familiar with the title for Jesus, "Lamb of God," because we hear it in our Eucharistic prayers during mass. The Lamb of God comes to take away the sins of the world. And, indeed, Jesus died that we might be free of our sins. The lamb figured in much of Jewish tradition, especially as a symbol of sacrifice, but certainly we recognize the image of "shepherd" as one who leads the flock through darkness and difficult terrain. The message of John's gospel is for us—the simple sheep - to follow Jesus, the shepherd.

Stroke support groups are local groups for those affected by stroke.


