### Choice

Moses reminds us in today's reading from Deuteronomy that we have a choice, to choose life by following God's way or to choose another way which leads to death. We need to hear God's voice, not the death voices of selfish individualism, violence and retaliation. Our gospel reading for the ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time concludes a series of extracts from the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel according to St Matthew. The Sermon on the Mount sets out guidelines for living in a right relationship with God and with other people, on living as followers of Christ. A superficial religion of pious expressions and external observance without love is not sufficient, such a religion will not be able to withstand the storms and troubles of life, including storms within the Church of God, and many whose religion is shallow and not based on a real faith and relationship with Jesus will fall away from God. Lent begins this week, it is a good time for a reality check, to ask ourselves how real is our commitment to following the way of Jesus.

The way of Jesus is the way of love, even to forgiving and loving enemies, the way of the peace maker, of the gentle. We are asked to have a spirit of detachment from the purely material things of life, to seek first the kingdom of God. We must be prepared to be different, to be the sharp salt that keeps the whole community flavoursome and healthy. We need to let the light of Christ shine through us by our lifestyle, our attitude to other people, by the goodness of our lives so that those who need him may see Christ reflected in us. We are called to love God and our neighbour in a whole hearted way, not to be half hearted. St Paul tells us in our reading from Romans that God's forgiveness is a free gift through our redemption by Christ Jesus. God is quick to forgive us, but a sign that we have received and accepted his forgiveness is that we in turn forgive those who have offended us. Jesus encourages us to build our lives on solid foundations, on rock rather than sand. We are to act on his words, not just listen to them. So we pray this weekend as we prepare for the start of Lent that we will indeed build our lives on rock and not on sand.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Readig: Deuteronomy 11:18, 26-28, 32

In today's first reading, Moses stresses the importance of the commandments to the Israelites by comparing the keeping of them to a blessing or the neglect of them to a curse. This spells out the seriousness of God's covenant with his people. When we turn away from God's commandments, we start to follow other gods. Moses encourages them and us to take God's words into our hearts and live by them.

Second Reading: Romans 3:21-25, 28

Paul's letter to the Romans highlights God's great love for us in redemption. Paul uses the phrase "the righteousness of God" to mean God's initiative in saving us. We cannot boast of our own holiness. We are holy because God has made us holy. It is God's free gift, and nothing but God's great love makes us deserving of this.

Gospel: Matthew 7:21-27

In today's gospel, Jesus points out that following him is more than a matter of simply saying words. We are each called to put our words into action. That is the way we truly do the will of God. Jesus compares it to a house that has a solid foundation and a house that is built on sand. If you've ever found water seeping into your basement after a heavy rainstorm, you know what it means not to have a house with a solid foundation. Our lives are like that. Living according to God's words and teachings make up the solid foundation of our lives. Faith becomes like the rock that will not erode. When God's words are not deep in our lives, our faith is like a house built on sand which gradually erodes and is swept away. Action, not just knowledge or words, provides a secure foundation for a life of faith.

Please continue to pray for Neil, Jeffery and Altin, that in these final weeks, the Holy Spirit will lead them to a deep awareness of God's loving plan in their lives as they are called to full unity with Christ in the Church.
