Offering Ourselves

The readings for this fourth Sunday of Easter speak of repentance, recognising God's voice, being redeemed by the suffering of Christ and having life to the full. In this they mirror the movement in our celebration of the Eucharist, when we repent, listen to the Word of God, participate in the sacrifice of Jesus at Calvary and are nourished by his lifegiving body and blood. Our Mass is a covenant meal, and we are children of God through the new and eternal covenant in Jesus' blood and are enabled to live a life of inner peace, that "peace of Christ which is beyond human understanding." The celebration of the memorial of Jesus' Passion is not a matter of ritual, but of an interior reality, a movement of our hearts. Our repentance involves a renewing of attitude, causing us to be gentle, kind and accepting of other people. Jesus tells us that as the sheep of his flock, his followers recognise his voice and listen to him. As we become familiar with God's Word we learn to recognise that voice and are guided by him. Jesus tells us he came so that we would have life, and have it to the full. We learn from his word how to live life to the full, to live with an inner peace.

Our redemption is the work and gift of the Holy Trinity: the Son who offers himself, the Father to whom he offers himself and the Holy Spirit through whom he offers himself.

St Peter reminds us of Jesus' suffering, and that we are healed by his wounds. Jesus offered himself and we too may offer ourselves as a living sacrifice. We offer our body and blood, our life and our death. Our life includes all our little occasions of life, to be lived in love and in a loving way. Our death includes all our little deaths, our humiliations, our failures, sicknesses, agedness, everything that mortifies us. The bread we offer is the bread of obedience, of love. As we are united with Jesus in his offering, God's creature goes back to him in a free and spontaneous act of love. And our offering is there, to be put into practice, after Mass! To be put into practice throughout our lives, and in our terminal weakness at the end of life; we can do this in the power of the Holy Spirit working in us, dwelling in us.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 36-41 Peter proclaimed that only in the name of Jesus Christ are sins forgiven and the Holy Spirit received.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:20-25

Jesus suffered for the sins of all people, and by his death on the cross, all can live in accord with God's will. People who strayed like sheep "have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls."

Gospel: John 10:1-10.

Using the image of shepherd and sheep, Jesus made an analogy for us to listen to the voice of God. Sometimes we are distracted by other voices that Jesus called "thieves." These thieves rob us of our desire to follow Jesus. True sheep, however, know the voice of the shepherd. The shepherd provides safety and life for the sheep.

Evangelisation - May '11

What does it mean to evangelise in today's Ireland? Jesus said 'go and make disciples of all nations,' but it can be something we feel unsure about in our own parish.

The next Synod of bishops in Rome will take the theme of Evangelisation and all dioceses are asked to participate in a consultation. The results of our conversations will be included by Bishop Buckley in the response of the Irish Bishops' Conference. This theme will help to focus on how we share the Good News of Jesus with one another and others in our communities, and call us to the heart of the mission of the Church.

Monday 23rd May 8.00-9.30 pm Clonakilty Parish Centre.



Age Action's Care & Repair Programme

Free Handyman Service for Older People Are you 65+ years of age and living in Cork City and suburbs, Ballincollig, Kinsale, Carrigaline, Glanmire or Carrigtwohill? Do you have a small repair job that you would like to have done for you? Age Action's Care & Repair service uses a pool of trustworthy volunteer handypersons to carry out minor repairs and odd jobs for older people who find it difficult to do these jobs themselves.

Some of the jobs that our volunteers can do include changing light bulbs, changing locks, minor painting and decorating, hanging curtains, minor gardening, minor carpentry and installing smoke alarms. The service is free; you only pay for the materials used. For your bigger jobs that are beyond the scope of our volunteers, we maintain a register of reliable and honest tradespersons whose contact details we can provide for you. We can also arrange regular social visits to older people. All volunteers are Garda vetted and carry official Age Action identification cards. You can arrange to have a job done for you by phoning the Age Action Care & Repair number, 1890 369 369.
