# Tenants of God's Vineyard

In today's readings, we see the infinite goodness, patience and mercy of God in his dealings with his chosen people and we also see the ingratitude shown by them. The first reading from Isaiah provides the background for the Gospel reading, where Christ compares the kingdom of heaven to a vineyard promised as an inheritance, but rejected by an ungrateful generation. The Lord expected justice in his own people, but found bloodshed. He expected that they would act with integrity. Instead he hears the cries of distress from those who are suffering the most – the poor who are oppressed by those who should be acting with integrity. God sent them prophet after prophet to recall them to their senses, but they turned on these messengers and refused to heed their warnings.

As members of the Body of Christ, we are especially privileged to be called to work in the Lord's vineyard, to be cared for and nurtured. With privilege, comes responsibility and good stewardship! We are challenged to go forth and bear fruit. We receive God's gifts with a spirit of gratitude and that gratitude leads us to share our gifts, to help others, and to act with justice and integrity. God calls us to be faithful stewards of his creation. We welcome this time of Harvest Thanksgiving again. As we look at the fruits of the harvest, presently displayed in front of our altars, they are a reminder to us of God's goodness. We give thanks to God for all he has given us to enjoy. The sun that warms us, the rain to make the earth fruitful. The wonderful scenery of land and sea that we have in real abundance in this land of ours. All of these are God's gifts which are freely given to us. If people in our world go to bed hungry every night it is not because God isn't caring for them, but rather because of the greed of humanity - tenants of his vineyard.

To-day we celebrate" Day for Life"- a day set aside each year to celebrate the dignity of life from conception to natural death. This year's theme, taken from St Paul's Letter to the Romans, encourages us to, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer". The idea of the Day for Life is to help us remember that we are made in the image and likeness of God and so carry a dignity that cannot be taken away. This year, the focus is on what it means to live a full and happy life. It takes as its starting point these words of Pope Benedict spoken to youth during his recent visit to Britain: "Happiness is something we all want, but one of the great tragedies in this world is that so many people never find it, because they look for it in the wrong places. The key to it is very simple – true happiness is to be found in God. We need to have the courage to place our deepest hopes in God alone, not in money, in a career, in worldly success, or in our relationships with others, but in God. Only he can satisfy the deepest needs of our hearts".

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

The prophet Isaiah wants us to listen to what God has done for his chosen people.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

St Paul assures us that there is no need to be anxious. God will give us what we need and he will also give us the great gift of peace.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

Using a parable, Jesus got the Jewish leaders to admit their error. He described a vineyard owner (God) who sent slaves (prophets) to collect his share of the harvest from the tenants (Jewish leaders). But the tenants killed the slaves. The landowner sent more slaves, but the tenants killed them, too. Finally the owner sent his son (Jesus). Of course, they killed the son. Jesus summarised his point by telling the chief priests and elders that what they had rejected (their place in the kingdom) would now be given to the Gentiles.
