"God Calls Us" Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The theme of today's readings is 'God calls us'. Vocation is not just for a few chosen people. All of us have a vocation, a specific call from the Lord to follow and serve him in a particular way. Everyone is called by God to be something, to do something for others with their life and with their unique gifts. Jesus calls us to make his love visible in the world. When we love and care for others, we make God's love visible.

In the first Reading we see God repeatedly calling Samuel. He did not recognize God's call at first, thinking it was Eli calling him but when he realized it was God calling him he responds 'speak Lord your servant is listening'. In our life God continually calls us though we may not always realise it is him! He especially calls us to a relationship with him. Are we ready to listen to him and to give time to him in prayer? In the Gospel we hear of two men who are already disciples of John the Baptist. John points Jesus out to them, "Look! There is the Lamb of God!" Hearing this, the two disciples follow Jesus. He asks them: "What do you want?" and they respond: 'teacher where do you live'? Jesus invites them to 'come and see'; they both accept the invitation and stay with Jesus. One of the disciples was Andrew and it was he who went and called his brother Simon Peter to come and meet Jesus. We all evangelize when we bring others to Jesus! As we begin the week of Prayer for Christian Unity (18 -25 Jan) we pray the Lord will give us the grace to hear our call and respond to him.

The theme for this week of prayer is based on St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 15:51-58): "We will all be changed by the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ". The prayer was prepared by a working group composed of representatives from the Churches in Poland. Christ's victory enables us to look into the future with hope. This victory overcomes all that keeps us from sharing fullness of life with him and with each other. For Christians unity among us is above all a gift of God. It is a share in Christ's glorious victory over all that divides. Change is at the heart of our Christian faith. Saint Paul said that anyone who is in Christ is a new creation, and we are called to live as children in the light.

Reflection for Parents

Try to imagine the excitement these first disciples felt when they heard Jesus' words. There must have been something very compelling in what Jesus said and the hope he gave these men in order for them to drop everything and not only follow him, but to go to others with the exciting news. That's how our enthusiasm should reach our children. It would be good to check our own level of enthusiasm for Jesus' call to us so that whenever our children hear our words and stories about Jesus, they will immediately recognize our passion.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: 1 Samuel 3: 3-10,19

Like John the Baptist, Samuel was born when his mother thought she would never have a child. She dedicated him to the service of God in the Temple where he received his special calling from God. This extract recounts the moment of that calling and states that the Lord remained with him in a special way all his life.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians, 6: 13-15, 17-20

St. Paul explains the foundations of Christian chastity. The human body made for God must not be debased for present pleasure. The body is eternal and should be respected. The popular modern sentiment: "my body is my own" is contradicted by Paul who says: "You are not your own property; you have been bought and paid for." Jesus bought and paid for us with his own blood shed on Calvary.

Gospel: John 1: 35-42

This is the moment when the Church began to find its Saviour. The solemnity and grace of the simple narrative are equal to the occasion: John the Baptist standing, two disciples nearby. The disciples follow Jesus. The heavenly attraction had begun to exercise its power. Jesus turned and gazed on the two men following him and spoke the first words from the lips of the Saviour reported by St. John: a "What do you want?". That same question is asked of all of us who follow Jesus: "Why do we follow him? What is it that we seek?



For Families of Children Preparing for First Holy Communion Learning About the Mass with Kath and Qumen

THE READINGS

The Minister of the Word goes to the ambo to read. The first reading is usually from the oldest part of the Bible called the Old Testament. In the Easter Season the first reading comes from the New Testament. The stories that we hear during the first reading are the same stories that Jesus would have heard when he was a child. Some of the stories from the Old Testament are thousands of years old. They remind us of how long people have been listening to God's word. They also tell us how much God loves us. Even though the stories are very old, they still have an important message for us today.

THE PSALMS: The psalms are different from the other readings from the Bible. They were written as poems or songs. There are 150 psalms altogether. Sometimes the psalm is sung. Between each verse there is a response which we are all invited to say. The psalm allows us to reflect on the reading that we have just heard.

SECOND READING: This reading always comes from the part of the Bible called the New Testament. The reading is taken from the books that are found directly after the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

OUR RESPONSE TO THE READINGS: At the end of each of the readings the Minister of the Word finishes by saying, 'The Word of the Lord' and we all respond with the words, 'Thanks be to God.' This is our way of saying thank you to God for these stories which help us to grow together as members of God's family.
