First Sunday Of Lent

As we begin Lent again, we learn that we need to be purified of our sins. Jesus went out into the desert to be put to the test for us, to overcome Satan. If we go into the desert with him, whatever is evil in our lives can be overcome.

Covenant

This is the first Sunday of Lent and we begin our Lenten observance of prayer fasting and almsgiving. In today's gospel reading Jesus says that the time has come, the kingdom of God is here and we need to be ready. The forty days of the Lenten season recalls the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, and indeed the forty years of wandering in the desert experienced by the children of Israel. We at times experience a wilderness in our lives, times of temptations and dangers, and hardship. And we remember that God has told us he will be with us, will hear us when we cry to him. He has made a covenant with us, and promised that his faithful love will not be withdrawn. A covenant signified an agreement by which the participants are bound to each other in a family like loyalty. We hear in the reading from Genesis of the covenant with Noah, a covenant of safety, of salvation, foreshadowing the new and eternal covenant of Jesus. All the promises of the covenants of the Old Testament are fulfilled in Jesus, he is the new Adam who restores creation, he brings the safety and salvation promised to Noah, he brings the new law of love to complete the law of Moses, he fulfils the promises to Abraham and fulfils the covenant with David.

As St Peter reminds today us Jesus died for the guilty, to lead us to God. He gives to those who accept him power to become children of God, and he ratifies that new covenant with his blood, shed on the cross. Jesus says his blood is the blood of the new and everlasting covenant, recalling the words of Moses at Mount Sinai when he spoke of the blood of the covenant, the old covenant with Israel. It is by the new covenant in Jesus' blood that we are committed as family to God and become his daughters and sons. As we enter into Lent we pray that we will indeed experience spiritual growth and prepare ourselves for God's kingdom, confident in his covenant of life and love.

Note that special Eucharistic Congress candles are placed before the altars in both churches this weekend to mark the continuation of our parish preparation for the International Eucharistic Congress in Dublin in June, when we will publically honour the new and eternal covenant which we celebrate at every Mass.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Genesis 9: 8-15

God made covenants or agreements with men on three occasions in the Old Testament: with Noah, Abraham and Moses. These covenants implied that man agreed of his own free will to serve God. In return God would forgive and take care of mankind. The rainbow was aptly chosen as the sign of the covenant as rain from heaven had been one of the causes of the flood.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3: 18 - 22

Noah and his family were saved not only from water but by water, i.e. the water carried the ark aloft. In the same way the water of baptism saves us. The flood was a type of baptism that purified mankind.

Gospel: Mark 1: 12 - 15

Mark gives only a summary account of the temptation of Christ. Satan wished to discover whether Jesus was the Messiah and, if possible, to lead him from the path of suffering, which God had ordained as the course to be followed by the Redeemer. Mark alone mentions the wild beasts whose presence suggests the desolate character of the region to which the Lord had retired. John the Baptist was now in prison and Jesus went into Galilee where John had preached and began by repeating the call to repentance.

The Altar

Another word for altar is table. The altar table is in the centre of the part of God's house that we call the sanctuary. Sanctuary means 'holy' and this is indeed a holy place. The servers may prepare the altar. They put the following on the altar:

The Corporal A square-shaped white cloth on which the paten and

chalice are placed

The Roman Missal The book from which the priest reads the prayers

The Purificators Small white towels which are used to clean the chalice

and paten later in the Mass.
