Community of Faith

The readings of today certainly present a challenge. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we hear what it means to be a community of faith. The first group of believers were united heart and soul, they were eager to share Jesus' love, supporting one another, and loving and caring for those around them. Everything they had was shared and all goods were held in common. Their spirit of sharing resulted in no one being in want - an example for all of us today. Jesus calls us to build unity and peace in a society so often divided. In the second reading St. John reminds us of the importance of mutual love, faithfulness to God's commandments and belief in Jesus' saving death on the Cross.

In the Gospel story, the disciples are gathered behind closed doors when suddenly Jesus comes amongst them and greets them saying: Peace be with you. As if to reassure them, he shows them the wounds in his hands and side. The disciples are overcome with joy. Jesus is still with them. The mission that was given to Him by his Father, he now passes on to them - He "confirms" them in their mission, saying: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; those whose sins you retain, they are retained.- As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." They are to draw others to share their own experience of knowing and loving Jesus and being loved by him.

One of the apostles, Thomas, was not present. When the disciples inform him that they have seen the Risen Jesus, his reaction is one of disbelief. He wants proof and to see with his own eyes. Thomas was a faithful follower of Jesus and earlier was even ready to give his life for him. Eight days later when Jesus comes amongst them again, Thomas is present. He encounters the risen Christ and expresses his belief in the living God saying: 'My Lord and my God'. Jesus responds: "You believe because you have seen me; happy are those who have not seen and yet believe." Thomas' story is a common experience: believing always in the power of God does not come easy if we are going through difficulties in our everyday lives. All of us have a bit of Thomas in us! But Jesus wants us to have faith, to believe in God. We may struggle and question at times, yet because of our faith in God, we believe that behind the dark clouds of suffering, pain, and problems, there is a God who watches over us and who only asks us to place our trust in him. As St John reminds us in our second reading: 'the victory that conquers the world is our faith'. We thank God for the gift of faith and we pray that in times of doubt, of burdens and trials that we continue to place our trust in Him.

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THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 4: 32-35

This is a description of life in the community of early Christians. Goods were shared but this sharing was always voluntary. The story of Ananias and Saphira makes it clear they were not bound to sell, and after they had the price was still theirs. However, the community of goods does not seem to have been very successful because we read elsewhere that rich and poor still existed in the community and Christians from other places had continually to send alms voluntarily to Jerusalem, 'each man according to his ability'.

Second Reading: 1 John 5: 1-6

There are three dispositions necessary to being a Christian: to love the children of God, to love God and to keep his commandments. Jesus came 'by water and by blood'. Water and blood are symbols and refer the one to the baptism of Christ, the other to his death.

Gospel: John 20: 19-31

The Church has perpetually understood the words of Jesus, "whose sins you forgive..." as the institution of the sacrament of Penance. The sacrament of pardon was instituted on the happiest day in the world's history. Ever since it has brought a personal joy to believers as they feel the load of guilt lifted from them. The act of faith made by Thomas is the fullest and most explicit of all the confessions of faith recorded in the Gospels.

For Families of Children Preparing for First Holy Communion Learning About the Mass with Kath and Qumen

Holy Communion

The priest breaks the Bread of Life before it is shared with everybody. This reminds us of what Jesus did at the Last Supper, 'He broke the bread and gave it to his friends.' While the bread is being broken, we pray the Lamb of God together.

The priest prepares to receive the Body and Blood of Christ by saying a prayer quietly. He then takes the Bread of Life, holds it over the chalice and shows it to the assembly. We respond to this invitation: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed. The priest and Minister of the Eucharist receive the Bread of Life. They also receive from the chalice. We go to the Table of the Lord in procession to receive the Bread of Life.
