Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday is seen very much as the end of the Easter season. People of my vintage will recall Trinity Sunday was associated with the Easter duty and the final window for same. Meitheals were very popular work events in rural Ireland some decades ago, neighbours worked on these occasions from dawn to dusk to help out some neighbour, (on occasions it involved cutting the turf, at other times mowing the hay) generally they were long days, plenty of labour and some craic. This year a young man, in his early twenties, was at his neighbours Meitheal on a Saturday, he decided at 6 pm he had enough and quick as a flash remembered tomorrow is Trinity Sunday and advised his devout neighbour that he needed to attend to his Easter duty. The neighbour excused the young man from his work but the toss of several hours work grieved him for many a year.

There are many occasions in our lives when words fail us or perhaps it is impossible to choose appropriate words. Sometimes in times of sadness it can be difficult to find appropriate words, a similar situation can arise in moments of great joy, being present on these occasions and giving somebody our attention makes all the difference. To know that there is some one present who cares makes the world of a difference. It saws the sufferer from the feeling of being isolated or worse still being abandoned. Jesus said "Go make disciples of all people, baptise them I will be with you always." Jesus assures his disciples "Trust in me, I'll be with you always." This was the most important assurance he could give His disciples. He didn't guarantee them a trouble free life, not even success; they knew that as long as Jesus was with them, they would have the courage and strength to face whatever difficulties lie ahead. We ask the Lord to assure us that He will be with us in difficult situations. God's closeness shields us against a sense of abandonment and despair.

We begin every Eucharist with the names of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit on our lips. The Holy Trinity is a mystery to be celebrated with childlike love and trust.
