A Day to Remember

On Friday 25th May twenty three Ballincollig parishioners made their way to St Dominic's Retreat Centre, Innishmore, Montenotte. It was a day scheduled for their annual Retreat. The facilitator for the day was Martina Lehane Sheehan, who guided us other years with her spirituality and wisdom.

It was a day set to nourish the spiritual part of one's being. A day to absorb silence instead of noise, peace and calm instead of stress, just one day for oneself.

It was intended to strengthen oneself spirituality, so as to return renewed to all the demands of ordinary life. The main themes for the day were methods of prayer and our need for the light of the Holy Spirit in our lives. This was accomplished through imaginative and varied ways. There was input, silent prayer, without words, reading and reflecting on the gospel for Pentecost, accompanied by Lectio Divina. The place might be indoors, or out in the beautiful lawns or garden. Some were done singly, others in pairs and some with the whole group.

Incidentally there was food for the body too as all were served a delicious 3-course lunch!

The day concluded with a beautiful celebrated Eucharist in the chapel.

The beautiful setting, the peace, the silence, the inspiring talks, the unity as parishioners all helped to make it a day to be remembered.

We wish to thank Fr. George for having subsidised the retreat day. All the parishioners appreciated your generosity and your interest in their spiritual development.

Some remarks from the participants:-

It was a wonderful opportunity of having a quiet day away from ordinary life and it was moreover a day of renewal and a strengthening of one's faith.

I realised the importance of quiet time and of the making every effort to listen to the voice of the Spirit.

During the road to Emmauas walk (where two people walked together in the garden) I realised that Christ was truly with us, as we listened to one another.

During the Nature Walk I was aware of the presence of God through the flowers, the trees, birds, etc. All of which were his handiwork.

I enjoyed the privilege of listening to Martina on the Holy Spirit.

The Spirit speaks to us in quietness and stillness and I found the peace and effectiveness of non-verbal meditative prayer.

The need to make a renewed commitment to make time each day, however brief, to engage in reflective prayer, just as Jesus often removed himself from his busy life by going into the desert, up a mountain or out in a boat on the lake. So we also need to consciously make our space and time away from the bustle of life for quiet prayer.

Mindfulness, the benefit of shutting out "our chattering minds". How we can train ourselves to be in the present moment and then we shall be very aware of the Spirit and really experience the presence of God in us and around us.
