Taize

July 11th 2012 fifty one teenagers and five adults departed Ballincollig on the first leg of our journey to Taize. These young people are involved in the life of the parish as ministers of word, music and collectors for several years. More than half the group had spent four days in Taize in 2011, they were looking forward to their return visit, for the rest it was a journey to the unknown.

First stop was Annecy, then after three days on Sunday July 15th it was off to Taize. We arrived at approx three thirty, welcomed by Brother Jean Marie and the welcome team, soon accommodation was sorted and we were ready for our first night prayer with the bothers of Taize. Joining four thousand young people (from all over Europe and further a field) in prayer, singing, reading and ten minutes silence is a moving experience for all. This year we remained in Taize for a week, living in community, praying and singing with the brothers three times a day, as well as taking part in scripture talks, discussions and workshops. The week is a great experience with many highlights.

Sincere thanks to the many parishioners who made the trip possible by their financial contributions to the fund. Thanks to all who plan the trip and put all the necessary paper work in place, finally sincere thanks to the adults who give of their time to accompany the young people on the trip.

This Sunday's gospel Christ poses the question by Christ, It Who do people say, I am". The disciples gave varied answers. Peter then gave his answer. "You are the Christ". Jesus went on to teach his disciples. Peter was shocked by this teaching. Peter faith is a very personal faith, he had come to know Jesus, and he is beginning to think things out for himself. However being human he was also prone to doubts, Jesus persevered with him.

Like Peter every generation has to discover faith. We need to make the faith our own if it is to be influential in our lives. Peter's words were correct, but when he came to acting on that faith he had a hard time.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9

The prophet Isaiah notes the qualities of the Servant of God.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

St. James reminds us that faith and good works belong together. What good are kindly wishes to those who need clothing and food for today? Faith without good works is dead. Let us be concerned for the people around us who are in need. Good intentions are not enough. The love of Christ urges us to act for justice and peace for all God's people.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus teaches his disciples what they have gradually come to discover: He is indeed the Messiah. But he is a Messiah who must suffer and die. Peter found this hard to accept. For Peter, the Messiah would not, could not, suffer. Judging by human standards, not God's, Peter failed to accept God's will for the Messiah. Jesus assured all his disciples that they, too, must suffer, deny themselves, take up the cross, and follow him.

Suicide: We work to move the suicidal person away from ideas of suicide as quickly as possible.

Self-Harm: Self-harm is seen as a way of expressing an incredibly strong pent-up emotion; it is an act of survival.

Our ground-breaking approach can involve daily therapy sessions if needed.

Our service is completely free of charge.

'Be still! and know that I am God.' He is still our refuge and our strength.



Age Action's Care & Repair Programme Free Odd-Job/DIY Service for Older People

Are you 65+ years of age? Do you have a small repair job that you would like to have done? Age Action's Care & Repair service uses a pool of trustworthy volunteer handypersons to carry out minor repairs and odd jobs for older people who find it difficult to do these jobs themselves.

Some of the jobs that our volunteers can do include changing light bulbs, tacking down carpets, minor painting and decorating, hanging curtains, minor gardening, minor carpentry and installing smoke alarms.

The service is free; you only pay for the materials used. For bigger jobs that are beyond the scope of our volunteers, we maintain a register of reliable and honest tradespersons whose contact details we can provide. We can also arrange regular social visits to older people.

All volunteers are Garda vetted and carry official Age Action identification cards. To arrange to have a job done for you, simply call 021-4536554 and we will arrange to have local volunteers contact you.
