### Mission Sunday

World Mission Sunday is a day when Catholics all over the world join together to pray, celebrate and care for the whole family of the Church. A large and important part of our Church (40%) is still regarded as 'missionary' and needs our help to survive and grow to self-sufficiency. Even more challenging is the fact that more than 50% of the world's population has never heard of Jesus and doesn't know that they are loved unconditionally by God. World Mission Sunday is important. Our prayers and our donations mean that we share in the mission of Jesus by supporting the thousands of missionaries who put their lives at the service of God's people. The theme for World Mission Sunday this year is 'Growing in Communion'.

We are all called to be missionaries wherever we live. Today is an opportunity for us to recommit ourselves to following the gospel message in prayer; in our daily lives; in our relationships with others and in sharing that message. We live in a world that is in need of the gospel message of hope, solidarity, peace, love and equality. The Mission month of October reminds us all that we are bearers of that message.

In today's Gospel Jesus brings all his disciples together and tells them his view of greatness and success in life. While he was preaching on the Gospel of suffering, death and service, they were looking for power, fame and glory. He says that 'anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant'. Greatness consists not in what we have, or in what we can get from others but in what we can give of ourselves to others. Jesus Himself did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many. We are invited to love and serve God by loving and serving one another.

On 11th October, Pope Benedict XVI launched a Year of Faith which calls us to a renewed appreciation of the gift of faith, to deepen our relationship with God and to strengthen our commitment to sharing faith with others. Faith commits every one of us to become a living sign of the presence of the Risen Lord in the world. This 'Year of Faith', which continues to the 24th November 2013, provides us with an opportunity to look at how our lives can be strengthened by a renewed confidence and hope

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11  
 In today's reading, we hear how the Messiah will give His life as an offering for sin; His suffering will bring people to God.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16  
 Jesus Christ is a priest; that is, Jesus Christ is a great mediator. He knows our faults and failings, because He shares our human nature. Because Jesus is our priest, we can draw near to God with confidence.

Gospel: Mark 10:42-45  
 We can often recognise those who are considered great in the world by the number of people they have serving and protecting them. Jesus teaches his disciples that it cannot be like that with them. He has come not to be served but to serve others, especially the poor and those who need healing. His greatness is seen most clearly in his laying down his life for others.

**Weekly Contribution - Tax Rebate**

Helping Ballincollig parish financially without dipping into your pocket. Weekly many people contribute at least five euro to the offertory collection. This contribution could be enhanced by claiming from the Dept of Finance the income tax paid by the donor on five euro a week. This tax rebate (can be claimed by organisations with charitable status which Ballincollig parish has,) would amount to at least €40 per eligible donor. I need your help to implement this scheme.

The dept of finance will need a record to be kept locally verifying the contributions. The simplest method to implement this is, for parishioners to voluntarily record their contribution. To make this possible I intend to supply boxes of envelopes with a number; invite parishioners to record the no on their box with me and then on a weekly basis note the no and amount.

The present direct debit gives an annual windfall from Dept of finance of more than €7,000.00, with your co operation I hope to double that amount. Please talk to me if you need clarifications. Thank you for your support.
