## Thirty First Sunday In Ordinary Time.

*The heart of our faith and its practice, is contained in today's readings. God is one and he is loved with all our being. We are to love our neighbour as ourselves. Both go together. Our faith in God and our love for him, informs our love for our neighbour and this in it's turn, is the expression of our faith—love for God.*

### ***The Commandment of Love***

In today's Gospel, one of the Scribes approaches Jesus asking which is the greatest of the commandments of the Law. Jesus refers to the words of Moses, which we hear in the first reading: 'You must love God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength'. Jesus adds a second commandment - just as important as the first: 'you must love your neighbour as yourself'. If our love of God is real, Christ is saying, it will express itself in love for our fellow human beings. This gospel passage focuses on important areas of the Christian life. One is our personal relationship with God. Then there is Jesus' second commandment. If our love for God is genuine, it will naturally take shape in practical concern and service towards others.

When we reflect on how God loves everyone as much as he loves us, we think of everyone in a new way. Everyone is special to God. The love we know God has for ourselves is also the love God also has for the person beside me, those I live with, for my neighbour, for the people I may not particularly like, and the people who may not particularly like me! We are all God's beloved. Everyone is in some way a reflection of God, the God who loves us.

Our second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews talks of Jesus as priest: 'Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him'. When we think of how much God has done for us and how much God loves us we owe him a debt of gratitude.

This week-end, we commemorate the death of our loved ones. In the Preface for Christian death, we pray: 'Lord, for your faithful people, life is changed, not ended'. Death is not an end. For the Christian, death is a door opening to admit his or her soul into eternal life. As we celebrate the sacred memory of all those dear to us, we pray for their eternal joy and peace.

"God, our creator and redeemer, by your power Christ conquered death and returned to you in glory. May all our loved ones who have gone before us in faith share his victory and enjoy the vision of your glory for ever."

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

**First Reading:** Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses urges his people to keep all of God's commandments. Then follows one of the most important statements in all of the Old Testament: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!" This prayer is as dear to Jews today as it was to Jesus himself and all the apostles. It is a statement of belief in the one true God. Then follows the teaching that was so important to Jesus: we are to love and serve God.

**Second Reading:** Hebrews 7:23-28

This reading continues the teaching on Jesus the eternal High Priest. Unlike the priests of the Old Testament, whose priesthood died with them, Jesus lives forever to intercede for us? He offers to the Father the perfect sacrifice of himself.

**Gospel:** Mark 12: 28-34

Today's gospel brings us to the heart of Christian living: Love God and love your neighbour. As we gather to celebrate the wonderful love of God for each one of us, we are given strength for the Christian journey. Jesus is asked to name "the first of all the commandments." In the first part of his reply, Jesus quotes the words from today's first reading: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with your entire mind, and with all your strength." Then Jesus adds another commandment, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." Jesus made the two commandments one. We now call this the Great Commandment. Loving God and loving neighbour cannot be separated. We love God by loving our neighbour as we love ourselves. The proof and measure of how we love God is shown in how much we love others.


