Thirty Second Sunday In Ordinary Time.

Our readings today show us two widows giving generously what they could hardly afford to give. Poverty need not lead to bitterness. It can lead to heroic generosity and courage. Such poor as these two widows, stand as a living condemnation of us who have so much. We give so little, as we watch the perpetuation of Injustice and poverty in our world.

Spirit of Generosity

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus warning the crowds not to follow the example of the scribes in seeking honour and attention from others. Jesus words to his disciples about the Scribes is as relevant today - that the spirit in which we give is more important than the amount we give. The widow in the first reading had only enough food left for one more meal before she and her son would die. She was about to prepare it when the prophet Elijah comes along asking her to share their meal with him. He promised her that in exchange God would replenish her stock. Here is a widow faced with the demands of a stranger. She took the risk doing as Elijah asked her and God repaid her trust and generosity.

The Temple in Jerusalem was the centre of Jewish worship in the time of Jesus. It was expected that observant Jews would make pilgrimages to the Temple to offer prayer and sacrifices. Pilgrims were also expected to make a financial contribution to the temple treasury. Jesus observes that those who were rich contributed large sums to the treasury. Those with less means made smaller contributions. Jesus' attention is drawn to a poor widow who makes the smallest of contributions - two small coins of little value. Jesus brings her offering to the attention of his disciples saying she has given much more than all the others. They gave from their surplus wealth; but she has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on. Despite her poverty and the anxieties that brings, God is at the centre of her life and in giving of her all it shows her deep faith and trust that God will provide for her needs.

The gospel as well as the first reading can challenge us to reflect on two issues: first, our response to those around us who are most vulnerable; and second, how generous are we willing to be in sharing of ourselves to build up God's kingdom. We are called on to be generous with our resources - not just material resources, but also to be generous with our time, our gifts and talents, our love and to be aware of the needs of others in our midst. In times of great need, we pray for a deep trust in the generosity and providence of God and we pray for a generosity of spirit to reach out to those who today are finding it difficult to cope with life's situations.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16

'Do not be afraid!' Elijah says to the widow. In times of loss, in moments of struggle, on the day when all avenues of escape seem to be closed, we are called to stand firm and remember that God does not abandon his people to death and despair. God will always find a way. Trust in him.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

Christ does not measure himself out in terms of what he has to spare. He holds nothing back from the Father and he holds nothing back from us. He gives himself totally, once and for all, emptying himself so that we might be filled with the divine life forfeited by our first parents. Christ teaches us how to give so that we may receive the abundance of God's mercy.

Gospel Reading: Mark 12:38-44

If we make a show of holiness we make a mockery of God. It is in the hidden, ordinary acts of love that true heroism is most often shown. If we are lavish in our outward demonstration of piety or charity but have hearts turned in on ourselves, what do we hope to gain? God sees not only our actions but also the intentions which lie behind them and we will be rewarded not so much for how much we give but for how much it costs us to give. The more we hold on to, the less free we are to move forward. They achieve holiness who dare to risk everything for God.



The copy of The Czestochowa Icon peregrinates "From Ocean to Ocean", - from Vladivostok in Russia to Fatima in Portugal, for the intention of the defence of life and family. The Icon has already visited over 20 countries. From 16th November, it will be travelling around Ireland and on 24th November will reach Cork, St. Augustine's Church. On that day we invite you for prayers and welcome the image of Our Lady

Queen of Poland.

Czestochowa Icon pilgrimage "From Ocean to Ocean" by the world in the defence of life is a joint initiative of the pro-life movement from many countries and international organisation "Human Life International". A copy of the icon of Czestochowa was applied to the original and consecrated by Archbishop Stanislaw Nowak, Metropolitan of Czestochowa at Jasna Gora.

Prior to this icon, leaders of the pro-life movement of the 20 countries, made the "Act to entrust the protection of the civilization of life and love". The Icon of Czestochowa is a gift of Polish pro-life movement for the Russian movement. Leader of the pro-life movement in the East is the Orthodox Church, and in the West, most of them are Catholics. They turn to their bishops, asking for a blessing and adoption of pro-life pilgrimage icons. Czestochowa icon links East and West.

Ireland is 22nd of the 25 countries to which the image of Our Lady of Czestochowa will make its pilgrimage. Then the image will be taken to France, Spain and Fatima in Portugal. Pilgrimage "From Ocean to Ocean" is a great act of faith in victory. The Czestochowa icon in the East is called: "Invincible Victory."
