Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King
The kingship of Christ, is not to be seen in terms of any kind of political control or domination. It is not of this world. His rule comes from obedience to the Father and total service of people, unto death. It is the power of God over death and evil, promised to all who commit themselves in faith to him.

Feast of Christ the King

Today on the Last Sunday of the liturgical year we celebrate the feast of Christ the King.

In our second Reading from the Book of the Apocalypse, the reading speaks of Jesus as the faithful witness, who has washed away our sins with his blood. Because of his great love for us, he came into our world to save us. He proclaims the kingdom of God, the kingdom of holiness and grace, of justice, love and peace.

In the Gospel we hear Jesus and Pilate speak of two different kingdoms. Jesus answers Pilate, the Roman governor's questions by declaring that he was a king, but not of this world. He did not come to rule over peoples and territories, but to set people free from the slavery of sin and to reconcile them with God. He says: 'For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is on the side of truth hears my voice'. For thirty years, he lived unrecognised in a village and carried out the daily work of a carpenter. For three years he travelled around with a group of disciples; he healed the sick, he forgave sinners and was not afraid to challenge injustices. Christ's kingship is one of humility and service. In his unfailing witness to the truth, Christ our King ruled with compassion and justice.

The Kingdom of God is among us. He reigns in each of our hearts. He is always there for us and ready to help us on our journey through life. We can say we really belong to his Kingdom when we try to walk with him, when we try to live our lives fully in the spirit of the Gospel, and when like him, we struggle to make our world a world of truth, justice, compassion and peace. We ask him to remember us in his Kingdom; to give us the grace to remain faithful to him in the midst of the struggles we meet in our daily lives and that we may recognize and welcome him when he stands knocking at the door of our hearts.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Dan. 7:13-14

In today's Scripture reading, the prophet Daniel looks ahead in time and sees the coming of Christ on the clouds of heaven. We look forward to that coming. It will be a day of great rejoicing.

Second Reading: Rv. 1:5-8

Jesus Christ is king today, in a special sense. He is a reliable witness to truth; he is the first to rise to new life; he is the King of Kings. To the glory of God, Jesus makes us a new people, a royal nation, a holy priesthood.

Gospel: John 18:33-37

Generally, we do not find the title "Christ the King" in any of the Gospels, but here in John, Jesus accepted the title even though it was given to him with misunderstanding. Pilate mistook the title as political. Jesus corrected him by saying that his kingdom was not of this world. Through the title of "King," Jesus pointed beyond himself to God, explaining that his mission was to tell the people about God and testify to the truth God wanted revealed through Jesus.

Offertory Collection Boxes 2013

The boxes of envelopes for the Offertory Collection are available in both churches. Families are asked to take one box. Please use the envelopes for the Offertory Collection for the Vigil and Sunday Masses during the year, families who avail of the Direct Debit system are not expected to take one. The Offertory Collection is solely for the upkeep, maintenance, insurance, lighting, heating and related expenses of both churches. Thanks for your generosity and we look forward to your support for the coming year.

Weekly Contribution - Tax Rebate

Helping Ballincollig parish financially without dipping into your pocket. Weekly many people contribute at least five euro to the offertory collection. This contribution could be enhanced by claiming from the Dept of Finance the income tax paid by the donor on five euro a week. This tax rebate (can be claimed by organisations with charitable status which Ballincollig parish has,) would amount to at least €40 per eligible donor. I need your help to implement this scheme.

The dept of finance will need a record to be kept locally verifying the contributions. The simplest method to implement this is, for parishioners to voluntary record their contribution. To make this possible I intend to supply boxes of envelopes with a number; invite parishioners to record the no on their box with me and then on a weekly basis note the no and amount.

The present direct debit gives an annual windfall from Dept of finance of more than €7,000.00, with your co operation I hope to double that amount. Please talk to me if you need clarifications. Thank you for your support. A tax rebate of €7,923.00 was claimed in the 2011 tax year by those using the direct debit payment scheme.
