### Second Sunday of Advent

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord.

Last Sunday we moved into the Season of Advent. Advent marks the beginning of the Liturgical Year – Cycle C for those following the readings at Mass. Over these short weeks of Advent we make some preparation for the true Christian celebration of the Birth of the Saviour.

During the early days of the week we had the wonderful input of the Redemptorists leading us in Our Advent Retreat. We thank their leader Fr Noel Keogh and his colleagues for their welcome input as they explored the depth of our Faith on this year of Faith which marks the 50th anniversary of the Vatican Council.

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Bar. 5:1-9

In this reading, the city Jerusalem is addressed directly. Jerusalem, the principal city of Israel, is a symbol for God's people. God now makes known how he will save his people, how he will bring them back from exile, how they will be united in peace and joy.

Second Reading: Phil. 1:3-6. 8-11

Advent is a time of fulfilment. God has begun a good work in us; he will carry that work through to completion.

Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

Luke was very thorough in placing the beginning of John the Baptist's ministry within a historical context. He set John's ministry in time by telling who the leaders were in the region. John's role was to prepare the way for Jesus and to proclaim a theme of repentance for those who would follow Jesus. Like a Roman corps of engineers filling in gullies and levelling mountains to make roads, John's job was to make the pathway smooth for those coming to Jesus.

**A Thought for Advent**

On a bitterly cold and blustery winter night, the pastor of an urban church knelt in the rectory. "Let me see your face, Lord!" he prayed over and over again. A knock at the rectory door disturbed his prayer. Reluctantly he rose to answer the door. Outside stood a disheveled, shivering man who asked, "Can I have some food?" The pastor led the man to the kitchen, scrounged in the refrigerator for a left-over, not too dried out sandwich. He poured a small glass of milk and added a tired slice of pie before placing the food before the beggar. He waited a bit impatiently while the man ate. He offered little conversation, not wanting to prolong the time until he could return to his prayer. When the man had finished, the priest escorted him to the door. As he closed the door, he immediately resumed his prayer, "Lord, let me see your face". In his mind's eye the face of the beggar instantly appeared. Words something like, "You have seen me," echoed in his mind. The priest threw the door open. Though the street was long and visible, the beggar was nowhere in sight. The priest had stayed awake to pray, "Lord, let me see your face," but today he believes he missed Jesus when he came to his door in the form of a beggar. Probably each one of us has a similar story of a time when Jesus whom we long to see came to us in the form of one of his poor ones and we failed to recognise him.

***During this Advent season we are to be on our guard lest we miss Jesus in the midst of our Christmas preparations.***


