Proclaiming God's Word

It was customary for Jesus to go weekly to the Synagogue to worship and on occasion to read the scriptures and comment on them. On this occasion the people in his hometown of Nazareth listen intently. There was an air of expectancy - the news of his miracles and his teaching had spread - so, if Jesus could do all of those wonderful things in other places, how much more so in his own home town! Initially the crowd are impressed at the 'gracious words' he speaks. Then he tells them the 'Good News' that "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" - the prophesy of Isaiah has been fulfilled - Jesus is the awaited Messiah. They are not sure how to respond to his words and begin to question Jesus' claim, asking 'is this not Joseph's son?' After all, they had watched Jesus grow up from the time he was a small boy! Having told them that a prophet is not normally accepted in his own place, Jesus lets them know that his mission is to all people and no one is exempt. God welcomes everyone without distinction.

In the Old Testament we see how the prophets were rejected in their hometown and by their own people. Now Jesus also experiences similar rejection by his own people. In their eyes he did not respond to their expectations. In a short time the people of Nazareth have gone from praising him to planning to kill him. Their efforts fail as Jesus slips quietly away from them. As followers of Christ, we too are all called to welcome everyone without distinction and to stand up for those excluded or rejected in our society today.

In today's Second Reading St Paul speaks about the importance of the gifts of the Spirit saying that love is the most important gift of all. It is love that enables us to be compassionate, understanding, patient, forgiving and accepting others. Unconditional love is the love that God has for every single person. We are to respect the dignity of every human being. There are so many divisions in society but with God there are no divisions, we are all members of his one big family. In times of struggle and rejection God is saying to us as he said to the prophet Jeremiah in today's first reading: 'I am with you; I will make you strong'

Reflection for Parents

How many times do we react to what appears to be the situation? A few times of being wrong slows parents down and teaches us that "things are not always as they seem." It takes time and often forces us to "eat humble pie" (or at least laugh at ourselves), but very often, by the time we "get the story" we recognize that we have come to the wrong conclusion, that the evidence is misleading. We need to show our children that we trust and have faith in them. If our first impression turns out to be correct, then we can take necessary disciplinary steps, but at least our children recognize our faith in them as our first response.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before your birth I blessed you. I appointed you a prophet to all nations. The will fight you but not prevail, for I am with you.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:13 Love is patient; love is kind. In the end there are only three things that last, faith, hope and love, and the greatest of these is love.

Gospel: Luke 4:21-30

Jesus went to Nazareth and taught in the temple. At first the people were amazed at his knowledge but then it occurred to them, he was one of them--a carpenter in their own village! They became very angry with Jesus and planned to throw him bodily from a nearby mountain top. Jesus simply walked through them and left. Some scholars say that the crowd's reaction and Jesus escaping them to continue his teaching and preaching is a foreshadowing of Jesus' death and resurrection and the mission of the Church to continue spreading the Good News.

St Blaise

Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia, is believed to have been martyred in the early Fourth century. Very little is known about him. Tradition states that he was a physician before becoming a bishop. Since the eighth century he has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from disease of the throat. He is said to have healed a boy who was choking. The blessing of St Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick.

Using two crossed and unlighted candles, blessed on the memorial of St Blaise or on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, the priest touches the throat of each person, saying: Through the intercession of St Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat and from every other evil (or from every disease of the throat and from every other illness): In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We pray too, during Lent, that Christ's light will shine on every part of our lives and our parish community so that we will be able to renew our Baptism with faith and joy at Easter.


