#### The Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem

Like many of you who got the chance I watched, prayed and reflected with great interest the inaugural Mass of Pope Francis. I thought I might insert some observations around his presence and his inspirational words. His inauguration coincided with the great feast of St Joseph. Pope Francis put forward in simple language his understanding of His role as Pope as that of guardian, custodian and intentional service to all creation and all persons, especially the most vulnerable. He offered hope and insight into the giftedness of creation of which we in our humanity are part of. Like Joseph he suggested we be attentive to God's plans not just for ourselves but for all. Looking at things realistically and to be guided by the Spirit of Wisdom that resides in our hearts, minds, spirits. To guard our feelings and emotions and yet not to be afraid when the opportunity presents itself for goodness, sensitivity and tenderness. And giving a sense of the realistic approach Francis makes to today's world and for us God's people he says "Today too, amid so much darkness, we need to see the light of hope and to be men and women who bring hope to others. To protect creation, to protect every man and every woman, to look upon them with tenderness and love, is to open up a horizon of hope; it is to let a shaft of light break through the heavy clouds; it is to bring the warmth of hope! - That message of hope was echoed in our recent Lenten Retreat by Fr. J.P O'Riordan.

This week we enter the Holy of Holy Weeks. The One who assumed our deepest nature of humanity. Emptying Himself of His divinity in order to share our humanity. By virtue of sharing our humanity we are offered a share in his divine, eternal nature. In the offering at Mass as the water is mixed with the wine to be blessed and offered as Christ's Body and Blood the prayer the following words are used "by the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled Himself to share in our humanity."

The second reading in today's Mass is a marvelous depiction by St Paul to the Philippians of this self-emptying.

My dear friends I think and believe that the Holy of Holy Weeks challenges us to empty ourselves unto Him.

To surrender or let go that which our humanity needs His touch. It isn't particularly sin I'm talking about but the areas that Christ touched in His humanity that offered compassion, healing, new relationship, non condemnation, the call to Prayer, the letting of me féin or ego stuff in order to serve Him. All that needs change, renewal, transformation in order to reflect that we are in our humanity alto Christos – other Christ's. It might run risk of suffering, misunderstanding, ridicule, humiliation.

# **Reflection for Parents**

There is much to reflect on in this reading. One interesting note, however, is the different responses Judas and Peter had when they came face to face with their rejection of Christ. After his three denials, Peter "wept bitterly." These tears of regret led the way to reconciliation when Peter first encountered the risen Christ. Judas, on the other hand, knew what he did was wrong, but he couldn't face the hopelessness his actions brought. To relieve the pain of what he had done, Judas took his own life. Some days it is difficult (even beyond measure) to be a parent. The lesson we learn today is that reconciliation and healing bring us long-term joy instead of living in the harsh bitterness of despair.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

The servant of the Lord was rebuffed but did not turn back; he was beaten and spat upon. The suffering one knew the Lord God was with him.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Christ was in the form of God but did not consider equality with God a thing to be grasped at. He emptied himself, took the form of a slave, and was obedient unto death! Therefore, God exalted him, and all proclaim him Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14-27:66

Each year on this Sunday we follow the events of Jesus' life from the time he entered Jerusalem until the point where he was laid in the tomb after his crucifixion. Jesus first entered Jerusalem riding a donkey amid waving palm leaves. It was in Jerusalem that he foretold Judas' betrayal, Peter's denial, and established the Eucharist at the Passover meal. Jesus took his disciples into Gethsemane to pray, but they could not stay awake with him. In the garden, Jesus was turned over to the authorities, tried before the Sanhedrin, brought to Pilate, and sentenced to death. When offered a choice during the festival to release a prisoner, the people chose the release of Barabbas. Their choice was beyond Pilate's comprehension, so he symbolically washed his hands of the whole deal. Jesus was turned over to the Roman authorities for crucifixion and mocked by them. Finally, Jesus died on the cross. The earth darkened and quaked. He was prepared quickly for burial and laid in the tomb.
