

Good Shepherd Sunday

"The sheep that belong to me, listen to my voice, I know them and they follow me," This Sunday is some times called Good Shepherd Sunday as the gospel often speaks of Christ as the shepherd and his flock of sheep. Today is also often called Vocations Sunday.

Some professions in life are referred to as vocations, immediately nursing, teaching, a doctor or any of the caring professions fit comfortably with the label vocation. Parenting is the great vocation for Christians. Parents are life giving, they nurture their children; they encourage, protect and provide for their children. Parents love their children and this love leads them to make sacrifices for them week after week. Parents strive to provide an environment for their children to ensure that they can develop their talents and potential.
