Christ Loves Us

There is a story told about a fifty year old Greek very ill in a hospice in New York. He boasted that he had a good life. He would do it all over again. Days before he died he sent for members of his family, who were he said, quarrelsome and at odds with one another. He solemnly told them that they must learn to love one another, they must try harder. Loving was everything. They must believe this as they were the words of a dying man.

Jesus spoke a similar message to his friends the night before he died. He gave them a simple clear message, "love one another as I have loved you.". "By this love you have for one another everyone will know you are my disciples." The ultimate test of success for followers of Christ is "loving as Christ loves us"; sometimes not always easy to love those close at hand, yet these are the people Christ asks us to love. We must begin by loving the people near us. That is where our love must start, but of course it doesn't have to end there.
