Jesus' Farewell Gift

In today's Gospel, we hear that the disciples are gathered around Jesus the night before he faces his death on the Cross. All of us experience at some time in our lives the sadness and pain of 'letting go' of a loved one who is dying. The disciples are now facing the reality that Jesus will not be with them much longer. Jesus is aware of their deep sadness and anxiety and tells them 'do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid'. He goes on to reassure them that they will never be alone; that when he is no longer physically present with them, his Father will send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will always be with them to help them and to remind them of all Jesus had said to them.

Jesus' farewell gift and wish for his disciples is a message of peace. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." As Jesus prepared to return to his Father, and in spite of the suffering he knew he was facing, he was at peace knowing he had accomplished the mission for which he was sent. He teaches us that peace comes from recognizing God's presence in and around us, made possible by the gift of the Holy Spirit. When we allow ourselves to be led by the Spirit, we experience peace. Let us today pray for that gift of peace; peace in our hearts, in our homes, and in the world. Jesus also says, 'if anyone loves me, they will keep my word, and my Father will love them and we shall come to them and make our home with them'. How privileged we are that God wants to make his dwelling in each of our hearts! I ask myself, how aware am I of God's presence in those I meet each day?

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles also reminds us that even today, with all its blessings and resources, the Church still continues to face difficulties in the carrying out of its mission. It is the work of the Spirit in us that enables us to respond to the call of Jesus. We pray to be open to the guidance of the Spirit that Jesus promised us.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 15:1-2. 22-29

One problem in the early Church was whether Christ meant his message for the Gentiles or only for the Jews. The apostles met in council at Jerusalem and decided to preach to the whole world.

Second Reading: Apoc 21:10-14. 22-23

The ancient Jews loved the city of Jerusalem, the site of the temple and the centre of their religion. In the Second Reading for today, John describes the Church as triumphant as a new and glorious city, the New Jerusalem. That new city is a symbol of the Church as she is today and she will be in the future.

Gospel: John 14:23-29.

In this Gospel, Jesus prepared his disciples for his return to God. Jesus promised them that the Holy Spirit would live within them and provide strength and courage. The Spirit would always be available to help them as a counsellor and advocate. Through the Spirit, they would recall the words and teachings of Jesus and even come to understand these things in a way that they could not before. In addition the disciples would receive peace from the Spirit. The peace of the Spirit would be a "shalom" kind of peace which provided a special inner serenity.

The Permanent Diaconate

Bishop John Buckley has issued a statement to an effect that he has decided to introduce the permanent diaconate in our diocese. Following the information sessions that were held throughout the diocese in 2010 Bishop Buckley has reflected on the observations made and believes that this is the opportune time to introduce this ancient order into the local church. In this, Bishop Buckley is following the practice of many countries that have done so over the past 50 years and, more recently, many Irish dioceses who have introduced the Diaconate. This development will be in tandem with the main pastoral thrust of the diocese which has seen growing involvement of lay people in the leadership and life of our parishes. One of the deacon's main functions will be to ensure that this development is consolidated.

The permanent deacon shares with the bishop and priest in the sacrament of orders. He can perform many functions currently associated with the priest: baptisms, weddings, funeral preaching. But, he brings the grace of his ordination to all aspects of his life and is expected to have a particular care for the poor. The Diaconate is open to married and single men alike; married men must be at least 35 on applying; celibate men can be accepted at 25. The upper age limit is 63 at ordination. The preparation takes four years. It consists of an introductory year aimed at helping a candidate to discern if he has a vocation and a three year study programme which is approved by the Pontifical University at Maynooth. The introductory year will begin in September next and those interested should contact their local priest or the Diocesan Director of the Permanent Diaconate: Canon Bertie O'Mahony.
