Tenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Life is God's gift. The theme that is common to the first reading and the gospel today is clear: to give and to restore life belongs to God. In neither story today is it intended to be a proof of the divinity of the person performing the action. Rather both writers want to say that Elijah or Jesus is concrete expressions of God's presence to those in need, the dead as well as the bereaved. In the person of Jesus of Nazareth, God was already walking among God's people.

Recent Tragedies

Just want to take you back to a couple of events that happened in recent months that were part of the world media. In April there was fire in a factory in Bangladesh that claimed the lives of more than 1,000 people. This led to questions regarding the ethics of business, employment exploitation and so on. Amidst the search and rescue families waited in hope that their loved one would be found alive or at least that they would be found and so able to bury their dead. Then there was the amazing story of the finding of a lady who survived for 17 days eating biscuits and drinking water from a draining pipe.

In Ohio there was the escape and release of two women and a child who were captive for years. Their families years earlier going through the trauma of a loved one missing; perhaps abducted and the search leads to nothing and then joyous scenes as their loved ones have survived and return to their families.

The meaning of the preciousness of life came into sharp focus more locally when Donal Walsh, a young person from Tralee appeared on the Saturday Night show talking about the issues of life and death. We are naturally often afraid to address the deep questions of life, death, suicide, the end of life.

The stories above came to mind as I pondered on the pieces of scripture revelation for this weekend. All the mixed emotions that surround the trauma of suffering, loss, death, bereavement and the joyous moment of realization of the promise of new life and resurrection that Jesus brings to humankind.

Our faith impacts our understanding of life and death, suffering and loss. What the prophet Elijah and Jesus Himself points to is a God involved at the very core of all aspects of life. When we take ourselves to the core of suffering, tragedy, loss, death, pain, we are called in faith as Christians to insert that faith into these situations. The anguish, tears, the cries, the promises of resurrection are evident in the compassionate Christ. When we look at the face of death and the language of the Cross let's find the support of our faith; talk about our understandings around the meaning of life and death with family, friends, others. In such a sharing perhaps we will be reminded of our mortal nature and see the sacred within touched by Christ. No harm in looking at today's scripture events with realism through the eyes of faith so that we might move from the fears, denials, illusions, that try to pretend otherwise.

First Reading 1 Kings 17:17-24

In this very moving and dramatic passage from 1 Kings we hear of how a young boy in the house where the prophet Elijah is staying becomes seriously ill. Understandably, the child's mother wonders if her guest, this 'man of God', is in fact the cause of her son's condition. Elijah takes the child, pleads with God to revive him and returns him safe and well to his mother.

Second Reading Galatians 1:11-19

Paul is eager to demonstrate that he is not a spokesperson for any of the apostles, and that he was not influenced by anyone, other than Jesus himself, prior to, during or after his powerful encounter with the lord on the road to Damascus. Therefore, when he dispenses from traditional legal observances, he does so based on his conviction that this is an integral part of the gospel of Christ.

Gospel Reading Luke 7:11-17

In the era of dedicated news channels, the sight of funeral processions with the bodies of young people killed as a result of war or famine is not unusual. All too frequent, too, are the reports of young people killed in motoring accidents on our roads. No matter what the circumstances, there is always a grieving mother or father, relative or friend. The one response capable of helping in each situation is the one adopted by Jesus in the Gospel today: compassion.

Documents of Vatican II.

As the year of faith moves on (ends on 24th November 2013-Feast of Christ the King) we may be asking ourselves if we have made some effort to deepen our faith. The door of Faith is opened at one's Baptism but during the year Catholics are asked to open it again, walk through it and rediscover and renew their relationship with Christ and his Church. This year was chosen because it is the 50th Anniversary of the Vatican Council (Vatican II) and among the methods of deepening one's faith, Pope Benedict Recommended the reading of The Documents of Vatican II of which there are sixteen. All these can be read on the Internet or in Public Libraries. To encourage people to read at least some of the Documents, snippets from them will be given in the " Parishioner" from now until the end of November.

Public Opinion &The Media.

Since public opinion exercises the greatest power and authority today in every sphere of life ,both private and public ,every member of society must fulfil the demands of justice and charity in this area. As a result all must strive through the media of social communication as well, to form and spread sound public opinion.
