Eleventh Sunday In Ordinary Time

God is mercy unlimited - that is for those who are ready to turn from their sin to seek his love. Today's readings remind us that it is not God who limits his love. It is either our complacency or our fear which refuses to trust in so great a love.

Forgiveness, Sorrow, Unconditional Love, Amnesty of the Heart.

I try to keep up with visiting family and friends when I can. The welcome the host often provides along with a comfy seat; the cuppa; and even the bite to eat is always appreciated. As we chat there is often a wonderful exchange of truths about our successes, failings, love, sorrow, forgiveness, understanding and compassion.

A giving and receiving that is interdependent and often just pure gift. In today's Gospel there is the giving of a gift of another sort. It's the gift of God's forgiveness. In the heading for our reflection I inserted the word amnesty alongside forgiveness, sorrow, unconditional love, as I have heard forgiveness referred to as Amnesty of the Heart.

Of all the controversial things which Jesus said and did, nothing seemed to raise as much resentment as when he forgives sinners. Some would have thought that Jesus' gift was perhaps very extravagant and even blasphemous. The guests at Simon's house were not very pleased when Jesus pronounced the sinful prodigal daughter forgiven.

They complained 'Who is this man that even forgives sin?' The Pharisees worked very hard at keeping the Jewish laws. Jesus saw that they were so centred on the sins of others that they forgot all about their own. There is the touch of a Pharisee in us all.

The person who has made himself or herself unable to admit their sinfulness and need of healing denies themselves one of the most powerful gifts that God offers, the gift and experience of being forgiven. Being forgiven enables us to forgive in return and thus to love as Christ loved. If you have not received the gift of forgiveness then how can you forgive?

Let us look at the places in our lives, in our families or circle of friends that need forgiveness, healing, amnesty of the Heart. We do so only under the umbrella of God's love and within ourselves an attitude of humility.

At the end of that meal at Simon's house, who do you think were the two happy people? The sinful Mary and her Saviour Jesus. The woman was happy her deeds and sin were not going to be held against her, not by the Lord at any rate and Jesus was happy that His mission to find the lost had moved forward.

On behalf of Fr George, myself and yourselves the parishioners of the Parish, I wish to thank most sincerely Karen Sheehan, Tom Murray, Pat Kelleher and Con O'Sullivan for their dedication and commitment to the Parishioner which is such an important Parish/Pastoral resource. Thanks and enjoy, one and all, the summer break.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: 2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13

Nathan tells King David a story that helps David to see the terrible sin he has committed. Because he wanted another man's wife for himself, David deliberately placed the soldier in the front line of battle where he would be killed. God had given David so many blessings and David now realizes he has sinned against God. David is filled with sorrow but Nathan assures him of God's forgiveness. Like David, any one of us can lose our perspective and let our desires rule us. We are not entitled to take what belongs to somebody else. Pray for God's help against this temptation

Second Reading: Galatians 2:16, 19-21

St. Paul says that having faith in Jesus is what makes us favourable in God's eyes. Paul tells us that his faith is so strong that it's as if he no longer lives, but Christ lives in him. People should be able to see God's love radiating in us. Those who are so intent on keeping the law that they don't reflect God's love are missing the point. Keeping the law is important, but the law alone will not help us to be saved.

Gospel: Luke 7:36-8:3

In today's Gospel we see how Jesus forgave a woman, who 'had a bad name in the town', for 'her many sins' because she had shown sorrow for her sin; this happened in Simon's house where Simon had invited Jesus to a meal. Jesus turned to the woman and told her, 'Your sins are forgiven'... 'Your faith has saved you; go in peace'.

We too hear these words of God's forgiveness spoken to us by the priest when he gives us absolution for our sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Documents of Vatican II.

As the year of faith moves on (ends on 24th November 2013 - Feast of Christ the King) we may be asking ourselves if we have made some effort to deepen our faith. The door of Faith is opened at one's Baptism but during the year Catholics are asked to open it again, walk through it and rediscover and renew their relationship with Christ and his Church. This year was chosen because it is the 50th Anniversary of the Vatican Council (Vatican II) and among the methods of deepening one's faith, Pope Benedict Recommended the reading of The Documents of Vatican II of which there are sixteen. All these can be read on the Internet or in Public Libraries. To encourage people to read at least some of the Documents, snippets from them will be given in the " Parishioner" from now until the end of November.

Relation of The Church to Non Christian Religions.

The Church Reproves, as foreign to the mind of Christ, any discrimination against men or harassment of them because of their race, colour, condition of life, or religion. On the contrary following in the footsteps of the holy apostles Peter and Paul, this sacred synod ardently implores the Christian faithful to 'maintain good fellowship among the nations' (1 Peter 2:12) and if possible to live for their part in peace with all men, so that they may truly be sons of the Father who is in heaven.

Night at the dogs in aid of Hope Foundation.


