"Care for Life"

Today, we celebrate 'Day for Life' This is a day set aside by the Church each year dedicated to celebrating and upholding the dignity of human life. In his Message for today, Pope Francis says that "all life has inestimable value, even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live for ever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect. The culture of life affirms the inherent value of life at all of its stages. Life is a precious gift and should be protected and nurtured from conception to natural death. Catholic social teaching holds up the vision that no person should ever be marginalised or set aside. All have an inherent value and worth that comes not from Governments or the State, but from the very heart of God".

In today's First Reading, we hear the frustration of the prophet Habakkuk. Discouraged by the injustice, oppression and violence that is happening to the Chosen People, the Prophet asks the Lord - "Have you abandoned us"? Habakkuk's words are the prayer of a believer who is distressed at what appears to be an overwhelming presence of evil around him. The Lord's response is to be patient; that justice will be done - 'because the upright man will live by his faithfulness'. In our second Reading St Paul advises Timothy, to whom he has entrusted new responsibilities of leadership, to remain faithful to Christ despite the criticism and opposition that he will encounter and to fan into a flame the gift that God gave him?

There are so many challenges and crises that we all face at some stage in our lives. How many in our Parish are going through a difficult time for one reason or another; perhaps illness; death of loved ones; injustices; unemployment; wondering where the next meal will come from, etc. We may be asking 'where is God in all this turmoil'. It is easy to say we have Faith in God when everything is going well, but not so easy in crisis situations. Yet as we see in today's Readings, the Lord is always with us, wanting us to remain faithful and to place our trust in him. We thank God for the gift of Faith and pray for all who are struggling today.

Garda Message

Garda Liam Linehan Community Garda at Ballincollig Garda Station has a word of advice for all members of the General Public from Ballincollig and Surrounding areas. It has come to the notice of the Gardai recently that there has been a very apparent rise in acts of thefts from motor cars throughout Cork city and county. It appears that a gang of criminals may be targeting cars which are parked outside areas such as Churches, Grave yards, Schools, amenity areas, sports fields, parks etc. These gangs are then breaking into these unattended vehicles in a smash and grab type scenario where they break the windows and steal handbags wallets, phones, cash or any other items which may have been left in the vehicle. To combat this type of crime we are encouraging everybody to be more vigilant when parking their vehicles and do not leave valuables in the car while you leave it unattended. We advise clubs and other such organisations to:

1. Ensure that all your members are made aware of this information.
2. Appoint where possible one person in your club/organisation to patrol or keep an eye on vehicles where there is a gathering of people for a particular event.
3. Encourage others to lock any unattended vehicles.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

In the first reading, Habakkuk cannot understand why God does not intervene to save his chosen people from their enemies. God himself gives the answer: they need faith.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

In the second reading, Timothy, a bishop in the early Church, is told to bear witness to his faith.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

Parents often live this Gospel well. Better than most people, they know what it means to "serve" without expecting a reward. For many, parenthood is reward enough. Jesus explained to the disciples in this passage that service was a requirement of discipleship. When the disciples asked how they could have more faith, Jesus explained that faith was a gift. Faith is not something we control, but only something we can appreciate as a gift from God. To show our appreciation, however, Jesus demonstrated through a lesson of service how we could show our thankfulness to God for the gift of faith. When we share our faith with others and demonstrate it by showing the love of God to those we meet, we proclaim our gratitude.


