### **Loss and Bereavement - Part 3 of 4**

At a time of bereavement and loss we need to take care of ourselves with regard to adequate sleep and rest because energy levels will be low. Food, Sleep, Rest and keeping oneself warm and tending to other general welfare needs are to be given priority.

Just as the five stages of Denial - Anger - Bargaining- Depression - Acceptance are inter-linked with each other so also are the body, mind, heart, soul and spirit. A healthy holistic Christian approach to body, mind, heart and soul is needed.

The different stages of Grief can interchange. Last week I looked at Denial and moved towards Anger. A person moves into Anger when they realise the reality of the situation and move beyond denial. Anger is a human emotion. Often the Christian tradition presents Anger as a sin but it is sin only when we let it leads to that which is contrary to the principles of the Gospel. With the benefit of understanding the psyche there is good reason to conclude that there is no right or wrong in feeling Anger. I can feel anger just as I can feel cold or thirsty or tired or warm. Let there be no judgment on our part or condemnation of ourselves if we notice we are angry. It is preferable to see a person letting go of their thoughts and feelings of Anger in an appropriate way through the support of others with a listening ear. It isn't good for the bereaved person or anyone else to keep Anger or indeed any other thoughts or emotions bottled up inside and then venting it much more dangerously in inappropriate ways. Anger can manifest itself with a mindset that points the finger of blame on the whole world. God, the living or deceased spouse, friend, person, community, and society may become the focus of anger vented against them or it. Alcohol abuse or drug abuse, promiscuity, missing work, school, carelessness about general responsibilities are signs of the presence of anger not dealt with properly. In myself I noticed that I had become disorganised, drinking too much, off centre. For a period of time a general "carelessness" and then it passed. These are reasons why Anger is dangerous if it isn't befriended by bereaved persons. There's a kind of craziness until this stage passes and people seem to pull themselves together and begin to recollect their good selves. They are then ready to bargain.

© Bargaining. Outright bargaining is more characteristic of children than adults. "I'll never hit my sister again if only my daddy comes back," is typical of the sort of deal children try to strike when someone near has died or walked out of their lives.

Adults, when they or someone close are dying, come up with sophisticated versions of the same childhood deal. We may make extravagant promises about our behaviour. "God spare Him / Her and I promise to do such and such every day for the rest of my life." While death is imminent the bargaining can be extravagant as loved ones make promises or commitments that are unrealistic and end up big a big burden or commitment. By all means pray but try not to add a burden as your beloved wouldn't want that.

As I look at my outlook now I feel with the events of Dad and my sister's deaths a tremendous appreciation of Jesus' mission of peace and His willingness to carry our pain, burdens. Pain and loss, if we let it, can be transformed. I feel unmistakably closer to Christ, closer to his community and Church, and closer to understanding the mysteries of our Christian faith. I will conclude my thoughts on Grief next week.

***Muskerry Local History Society***

Finding James, The Story of one woman's search for a family war grave in the First World War  
 Muskerry Local History Society are organising a lecture by Aideen Johnson on 'Finding James, The Story of one woman's search for a family war grave in the First World War'.

Over 200,000 Irish men fought with the British Army in the Great War, 1914-1918, approximately 30,000 of these men never returned home. Most, Like James O'Connor, were never repatriated and were buried thousands of miles away from home.

Through research James's granddaughter, Aideen Johnson, followed his journey once he left Ireland to when he finally died. This is an emotional journey which uses one Irishman's details to understand the lives these soldiers led and to pay tribute to their sacrifice.

The lecture will be held on Tuesday, 19 November 2013 in Ballincollig Rugby Club Hall at 8.00 pm sharp. Annual membership subscription is €10. Alternatively, a cover charge of €3.00 applies at each lecture.

**Did you know....?****.....about the new Catholic Theology Institute at Trinity?**


