We in the Vincent de Paul Society in Ballincollig are a family visitation conference. We see the parents who are constantly worrying about which bill to pay this week from their meager resources, be it electricity, heating, rent or mortgage, education, clothing etc.

The Society in the Ballincollig area is currently providing assistance to over 200 families; this us up considerably since last year.

We have funded local activities such as health care, home assistance, education, summer breaks winter fuel, etc. and where there is someone in need we are always there to assist in every way possible.

The annual Console Christmas Celebration of Light will take place in the Sacred Heart Church (M.S.C.), Western Road, Cork on Sunday 8th December 2013 at 4.00pm. The Celebration of Light commemorates the lives of loved ones lost through suicide. It is an evening of song, music, poetry and reflection, which includes the lighting of a candle and a minute's silence in the presence of others to remember those who are no longer with us on life's journey. The celebration also serves to provide support through contact with the Console community. Light refreshments will be served after the ceremony.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5
The Prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when all the nations will hear the Word of God and be united.

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14
St. Paul issues a wake-up call for this Advent season.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-40, 44.
The emphasis of today's Gospel is on the second coming of Jesus. Matthew refers to three events that show we do not know when Jesus will return, but the message is clear: we are to be ready! The first reference Matthew makes is to Noah and the flood. People were occupied with their daily lives / eating, drinking, and marrying. In the second example, men were working in the field and women were grinding at the mill. Some were taken and some remained. In the final example, the master of the house could have prevented the robbery if only he had known when the thief would come. This Gospel is a stern caution for each of us to live in preparation for Jesus' return.

Public Lecture

Diarmuid Lynch - A Forgotten Irish Patriot

On Saturday night 22 April 1916, a tense meeting in Dublin went on into the small hours to decide whether or not the Easter Rising would go ahead. Present at that meeting were Pádraig Pearse, Tomás MacDonagh, Joseph Plunkett and Seán MacDiarmada. The fifth man present at the all-night session, Diarmuid Lynch, was the only one still alive two weeks later. It is difficult to understand how Lynch, a member of the Supreme Council of the IRB, has been forgotten so completely.

In The Story of Diarmuid Lynch: A Forgotten Irish Patriot, a public lecture organised by Muskerry Local History Society, Eileen McGough brings that story to life, dealing with his involvement in the 1916 Rising and subsequent events. The lecture will be held on Tuesday, 3 December, in Ballincollig Rugby Club at 8.00 pm.
