Fourth Sunday of Advent

Advent is one of my special times of the year for many reasons. There is excitement and a buzz in homes as preparation for Santa gathers pace. "Then the house has to be decorated, cards sent and received and so on. Then the shopping goes on for some families, regrettably for other families much of pre-Christmas is stressful, difficult and full of demands as heightened expectations are usually expensive and beyond the reach of many. We might perhaps keep families in our thoughts, important that as adults and children we learn to share and think of others. So many are very generous, Christmas reminds us that God is very generous to us sending his Son as a baby to give us hope and freedom.

The special part of Advent for me is some of the readings. (Especially Isaiah Ch 40 and 41) I like especially the readings from Isaiah during Advent preparing us for the coming of the Messiah. The prophet Isaiah speaks about a very special child coming to us. Every child in King David's line was the embodiment of God's promise to be with the people. However we believe that Isaiah's prophecy found complete fulfilment in Jesus.

The reading from St Paul and the Gospel tells us more about this child. He has a double identity, human identity and also Son of God. He is Emmanuel "God with us". This part of the identity of Jesus was gradually understood, it was only after his death and Resurrection that the fuller implication came to people.

We also have a double identity, human from our birth and after Baptism we have become children of God. Like Jesus our divine dignity is recognised and revealed by the Father. Our divine dignity is a matter of faith like that of Jesus.

The 12 Days of Christmas

Religious symbolism of The Twelve Days of Christmas

1. True Love refers to God
2. Turtle Doves refers to the Old and New Testaments
3. French Hens refers to Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological Virtues
4. Calling Birds refers to the Four Gospels and/or the Four Evangelists
5. Golden Rings refers to the first Five Books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch", which gives the history of man's fall from grace.
6. Geese A-laying refers to the six days of creation
7. Swans A-swimming refers to the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven sacraments
8. Maids A-milking refers to the eight beatitudes
9. Ladies Dancing refers to the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
10. Lords A-leaping refers to the ten commandments
11. Pipers Piping refers to the eleven faithful apostles
12. Drummers Drumming refers to the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

The first reading contains Isaiah's prophecy of the events we celebrate at Christmas.

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul's message is another reminder of what we are preparing to celebrate.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

Matthew recounts the circumstances of Jesus' birth by telling us the story of Mary's engagement to Joseph and the child she carried originating from the Holy Spirit. This reality made no sense to Joseph, but he did not want to dishonour Mary so he planned to quietly divorce her. An angel came and told Joseph not to be afraid, that Mary's child was conceived by the Holy Spirit and that they should call him Emmanuel meaning, "God is with us."
