The Feast of the Holy Family: We are reminded today that a holy family will be a happy one because everything is based on God's will of love ...a love that shows itself in patience, forgiveness and sincere gratitude. The spirit of such a family will be the Spirit of God who brings peace.

The Feast of the Holy Family

During the early Autumn Pope Francis decided to embark on a journey and conversation with the people of God. The Pope is seeking the views of the people of God on the family. The accompanying documents draw attention to a number of points concerning the family. The family is very much understood in the Christian tradition as a little church where we are nurtured and grow physically but just as important a place where we grow in faith and experience the love of God.

Pope Francis notes that many of the changes in our culture and world impact in various ways on family life. Many of the supports that the wider family provided in former times are no longer available. The demands of work and a career on parents lead to huge demands on time and resources for parents. Today flexibility and short term contracts are part of everyday life in the workplace; again making further demands on family life. Unemployment creates huge anxieties for families. Difficulties for families trying make ends meet is an added burden.

Pope Francis presented a wide ranging statement followed by a number of questions. Some areas we are asked to address are, what preparation is available to couples planning their marriage? What support is available for married couples? The answer to both yes there is some but more needed.

What is the church's teaching on Marriage? The church teaches that marriage is a vocation. In fact Marriage is the great vocation! Surely this needs to be re-affirmed and taught regularly. Marriage is also a sacrament that the couple bestow on themselves and commit to living in their life. A sacrament means that God is present especially in the love of husband and wife, and that each marriage is a sign to us of God's love. High ideals but wonderful to be living in the midst of so many people trying to make this statement a reality.

May the Lord bless the trust Pope Francis is placing on us in his efforts to discover the "Sensus Fidelium" on this important topic. I wish you all a happy New Year.
