Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time

The light of Christ's love has been given to each one of us but it will go out if we fail to use it. We are invited to share our food, our homes, our possessions with the needy so that through us they can see the light of God and give him thanks.

Theme of Light

"You are the salt of the earth.....A city built on a hill top cannot be hidden."

As I mentioned here last weekend and during recent homilies and reflections I noticed an obvious theme of light in the readings and liturgy over the past number of weeks. This culminated in the sacramental of the blessing of candles last weekend on the Feast of the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Fourth Joyful Mystery).

Indeed I would like to thank those of you who told me of their own experiences of visits to certain churches and places of worship to light candles and spend quiet time with He who is the Light of the World and a great source of comfort, peace, a divine oasis.

Though I don't want to overdo there is that theme of light again in this weekend's Gospel as Jesus to His disciples and ultimately to you and I "You are salt of the earth..... the light of the world".

It seems to me that our challenge is that we are not to leave in peoples lives some kind of bitter taste and that we are not to hide our light or indeed bury it. Both are a contradiction to our calling to be true to our Christian calling.

I'm not so sure what tasteless salt is like but I think most of us recognise what it's like to be left with a bitter after taste in terms of food and in terms of encountering difficulties in life, in relationship, in decision-making. In opting to follow Christ, the road is often less travelled; because it is a narrow pathway and sometimes we choose what we think is the easier option and end up with that after taste of unfulfillment. In terms of light the symbol is an easy one to reflect on. Not only does light brighten the darkness it can also give heat and a sense of awareness of God's presence. But a candle for effectiveness also needs to be attended to, kept safe, lit, prepared, put in place, blessed, and sometimes trimmed.

We often hear of those who are the salt of the earth because they bring to the table of life a taste for life, a support for another, makes a difference. As we are nourished and feed in mind, heart and spirit at prayer and worship may we be the salt of the earth in terms of our humanity and our witness to the Christ we follow.

There are those too who come into our presence and in a way light up the room, light up our gathering. As Christ who is the light of the world touches our own light within and lets us share in His burning light, fire, life, may we in turn not just receive His gifts but pass them on to others.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10

Isaiah prophesied: Share bread with the hungry. Shelter the homeless. Clothe the naked. Do not turn away from your own. "Then your light shall break forth like the dawn."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul's teaching did not come from himself but from the convincing power of the Spirit. So the faith he passed on rests "not on human wisdom but on the power of God."

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16.

It is common for us in our times to be careful about the salt we use. However, in Jesus' day, salt was a very important commodity. It was used to pay salaries. Like us, people used salt to flavor food. But, because there was no refrigeration, salt was also used to preserve food. That is why, when Jesus called his disciples "salt" and "light," he declared their great importance. What was of significant importance to Jesus was the enthusiasm with which the disciples spread the Good News.
