## Perfect

Returning to the relatively lesser task of this week's reflection we continue to hear from THE SERMON. Jesus offers His manifesto to those who follow Him as He said to his disciples:

'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.'

During the last few days of January I was fortunate to get a short few days on the east coast. As schools were closed this week for mid-term some of you will have managed to use the break to rest, to get away, to study, to pursue interests in sport and other things.

While I was away myself I noticed many of the staff used the word perfect. It seemed that the word Perfect was a word that reflected the Ethos or goal of the place. As I completed my evaluation and comments I tended to agree that many aspects of my stay deserved the word PERFECT.

What stands out for me every time I hear these particular verses of St Matthew's Gospel is the final sentence

I admit that I am an organized person and I like order. Some might say too much so. I used to be worse. I used to be a perfectionist at all levels of life. Rather what is most important is our effort at every level of life is to strive to be and do our best. It is not black and white, in or out. Thankfully, it has been my experience in life, to know and experience God's perfect love, acceptance, tolerance, understanding and even humour mirrored in others.

As his disciple, follower, minister, child, striving towards He who is perfect is the challenge. A call to holiness, the spiritual, the divine is a call to share in a life, in and through God's grace, that allows us in our imperfections and limitations to forgive "our enemies"; to strive to avoid the popular call to revenge.

The ethos of our call is our decision to strive for the Holy, and truly imitate the Model of the Master and Teacher.

Sometimes it is because we know them that we accept some of the odd or annoying things they do. Jesus says everyone can love and forgive a friend. That part's easy. It is loving our enemy that may be the challenge. Nearly every world religion has a message of this sort . . . now if we could all just live it!

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18  
 The best way to love yourself is by imitating God's holiness. And begin by avoiding sin, especially the hatred which leads to bearing grudges and seeking revenge. It is not in anyone's interest to bottle things up inside. Instead be up front with those who have offended you in order to clear the air. Do not let the sun go down on your anger.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23  
 Human wisdom often seems to suggest that our value depends on what we own. The more belongings we have the more people look up to us. But God's wisdom turns this pattern on its head. Our dignity stems from our belonging to Christ, who in turn belongs to his Father. The Spirit is God's mark of ownership over us. We are no ordinary dwelling place, but temples of the Spirit.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 5:38-48  
 One disadvantage of a legalistic view of morality is that it can lead to minimalism, an attitude represented by the question, 'How far can I go before I commit sin?' The scribes thought that if they followed certain rules exactly they could claim a right to God's reward. But the call to 'be perfect as God is perfect' is a reminder of the open ended nature of morality. There is always an extra mile to go for others. The saintly person is always eager to go beyond the call of duty. We are to follow the example of the Good Samaritan who not only saved a man's life but was willing to pay the innkeeper to look after him. Jesus goes beyond duty in praying for his persecutor.
