May the Holy Spirit of Wisdom, Perception, Memory, Peace, Courage and so be available to all and give right perspective before us and offer a good disposition towards care of self. For now let support be there for your fellow students and let others support you in whatever way they can.

Not everybody will appreciate the difficulty that examinations may bring so be patient. For parents and members of the family it is necessary to be sensitive to areas that might cause tension and anxiety. As they say keep the lines of communication as clear and as open as possible.

Reflection for Parents

When children are orphaned, they often hold on to something to remind them of who they are. Orphan Annie had a half of a locket, Oliver Twist had a letter, and some victims of the holocaust had smuggled photographs. Even without the physical presence of their parents, orphaned children very much felt connected to their parents. This is the image Jesus gives us in the Gospel as well. He explains that it is the Holy Spirit that is with us and helps us know we are God's. It is this Spirit that guides us to live the way God wants us to. The Spirit comes to us in a special way at our baptism and guides us, even to our surprise sometimes, and helps us follow the commandments of God.
