Corpus Christi - The Body and Blood of Christ

The feast of Corpus Christi puts the focus on the Eucharist and especially the unifying power of the Eucharist. St Paul says "that we are like grains of wheat that have been brought together to form one loaf."

The Eucharist celebrates and strengthens our unity in Christ. The Eucharist "the bread of life" is prefigured many times in the Bible. The book of Exodus relates that a nomadic people as they were guided by Moses from slavery, were suffering from starvation, thirst and had lost confidence in their leader. However the arrival of the Manna not only fed them and gave them strength but also revived their confidence in Moses. Similarly the widows' generosity in the book of Kings 17; 7 in baking a scone for the stranger with her final portion of flour, refreshed Elijah the prophet and also renewed the widow's trust in God. The gospel of Mark 6; 30 speaks of a dejected people, like sheep without a shepherd and Jesus took pity on them and decided to feed them.

To the leper whose body was falling apart he offered the only bread that mattered to him, the bread of physical healing.

To the lonely woman at Jacob's well he offered the bread of human kindness and satisfied her hunger for acceptance

To the sinners he offered the bread of forgiveness.

To the man on the cross dying, he offered the bread of reconciliation with God.

The bread of the Eucharist brings us together and invites us to bring the power and presence of God to people.

Suicide: We work to move the suicidal person away from ideas of suicide as quickly as possible.

Self-Harm: Self-harm is seen as a way of expressing an incredibly strong pent-up emotion; it is an act of survival.

Our ground-breaking approach can involve daily therapy sessions if needed.

Our service is completely free of charge.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16
 Moses reminded the people that for forty years God tested them in the desert. The Lord let them be hungry and fed them manna, showing that God's people do not live by bread alone.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17
 By sharing in the Eucharistic bread, Christians, though many, are one body in Christ.

Gospel: John: 6:51-58
 As much as Jesus' listeners didn't understand how Jesus could really mean that they were to eat his body and drink his blood, Jesus made it very clear that that was precisely what he did mean. Once again, it was hard for the people of Jesus' day (and still hard for us today, too) to understand what Jesus tried to say because they only thought in earthly, literal terms. This Gospel passage gives us one of our firm foundations for the institution of the Eucharist so that, in faith, we will eat the bread that will give us everlasting life.

Cancer Risks, Did you know?

- ◆ Ireland has among the highest skin cancer rates in Europe.
- ◆ Two-thirds of Irish people have a higher risk of developing Skin Cancer because of their skin type.
- ◆ 90% of all skin cancers are preventable
- ◆ Damage to the skin by the sun is permanent. In later life this can lead to skin cancer.
- ◆ For the majority of the population, 10-15 minutes daily exposure of the face and hands to the sun and adequate diet provides a sufficient level of vitamin D.
- ◆ Skin damage is caused by exposure to ultraviolet rays, which are strongest from 11 am to 3 pm.
- ◆ The number of skin cancer cases is rising every year.
